

Article 13 – March 14 Town Ballot

CONSERVATION, CITIZENSHIP AND COMMUNITY

To see if the town will vote to deposit, 50% of the revenues collected pursuant to RSA 79-A (the land use change tax) into the Town's Conservation Fund in accordance with RSA 36-A:5 III as Authorized by RSA 79-A:25 II.

WHAT – Preserve Deerfield's Special Places with the Conservation Fund

HOW – The Conservation Fund protects land with significant conservation value. Examples – Weiss Town Forest, Peg King Park



The **Conservation Fund** currently receives 25% of the Land Use Change Tax. Increasing this to 50% enables the Fund to be more effective in preserving Special Places in Deerfield important to you.
