### Facilitation Skills and Participatory Decision-making Tools

This 5-session course in Facilitation Skills and Participatory Decision-making introduces the art and craft of facilitation through interactive lecture discussions, readings, videos, and practice. In addition to facilitation basics, this course will cover a range of facilitation topics, including: facilitation skills, group and individual behaviors, conflict resolution, coalition building and facilitation tools, including: community forums, focus groups, strategic planning, action planning and asset based Community Development. **A commitment to 4 out of 5 of the sessions is critical.**
