GREAT NEW TITLES IN THE LIBRARY

Avian Influenza: State, National and Worldwide View [Aud: Adults; INS: \$25; 1 hr.] Satellite Broadcast, 9/8/05. University at Albany, NY. This program covers the impact of an influenza pandemic on public health organizations and communities, and how to begin planning responses.

Ebola: The Plague Fighters. PBS/Nova. 60 minutes, VHS. Jr. High - Adult. When a dreaded outbreak of the deadly Ebola virus swept through a remote region of Zaire in May 1995, the NOVA film crew was permitted into the "hot zone" where they spent four weeks in the quarantined city of Kikwit documenting the grim battle against one of the world's deadliest diseases.

Public Health Preparedness: Pandemic Influenza California Update 2005. [Aud: Public Health Staff; INS: \$25; 1 hr. 30 min.] Topics include: measures to reduce the transmission of influenza, the availability of vaccines and anti-virals during a influenza pandemic, and the essential collaboration with outside agencies.

Supersize Me. (PG version) [Aud: Gde. 6-12, Teachers; DVD, 1 hr.] This education edition focuses on a healthy lifestyle, the consequences of poor nutrition, and lack of exercise. Includes classroom games, a teacher's guide, printable lesson plans, handouts, and links to other resources and web sites.

HOW TO REQUEST MATERIALS

- Who:** Health care professionals, educators, employers, and other NH residents.
- How:** Materials can be mailed to you or picked up at the PHS Library or your public library. Call, email, fax, or write (see next page).
- When:** For best selection, reserve materials three weeks in advance. Reservations are on a first come, first served basis. Items must be returned the day after the date of showing.
- Cost:** No-charge loan service of library materials. However, you will incur postage and insurance (INS.) costs if you return the materials to us by mail or UPS. Each audiovisual item has the insurance value indicated on the date due form. To avoid postal fees check with your public library about delivery/return service using the NH State Library van service.
- Other:** Onsite preview facilities are not available. You may not transfer or loan materials to another person or organization.
