*All 4-H project animals are shown at the risk of the 4-H owner or 4-H lessor. Any damage to persons or property are the legal and financial responsibility of the 4-H member and their family who own or lease the animal. All animals must be pre-entered to show, copies of approval form, lease, medical, and code of conduct must be included with entry form.*

## **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR 4-H LIVESTOCK SHOWS**

1. Parents of exhibitors, as well as exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of 4-H and agricultural education. All youth leaders and parents working with junior exhibitors have responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example.
2. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
3. All entries must be postmarked no later than August 10, 2009 and sent to the Extension office. No Late Entries Accepted.
4. **Eligibility:** The show is open to enrolled 4-H livestock members from Hillsborough County and invited counties. All animals shown must be signed up with appropriate county 4-H office, using "Approval for Animal Exhibits" forms.
5. **Entries:** All animals shown in individual classes must be owned or leased by the exhibitor and registered animals must be registered in his or her name only. Arrival - must be on grounds by 9 pm Friday. Entries may be limited due to space.
6. **Date Of Ownership:** Ownership as approved by breed, class.
7. No pending papers allowed.
8. **Health:** All animals must be free from infectious and communicable diseases.
9. **Checking Credentials:** All registration papers will be checked by the livestock Superintendent, verifying date of ownership and project eligibility.
10. **Exhibition:** All animals shall be cared for by the 4-H'er while at the fair with no adult assistance and any member so assisted, after one warning by the Superintendent, will be disqualified.
11. Exhibitors **MUST** show in the appropriate Fitting and Showing Class 4-H age, age as of January 1, 2009.  
Novice - ages 8 - 13, first year showing that species; Junior - ages 9 - 11; Intermediate - ages 12 - 13; Senior - ages 14 - 18.
12. **Awards:** The Danish system of awards will be used for all classes, with the exception of special awards in each division.
13. ALL Breed Classes must have 3 exhibitors participating in order to have their own classes. Less than 3 will be in a combined class.
14. Exhibitors are responsible for setting up livestock pens, and for cleaning pen/stall areas Sunday prior to leaving the grounds. Bedding/manure must be placed out beyond tent pegs/stalls in order to be removed. Stalls/pens must be cleaned before animals may be removed from grounds.
15. **WITHHOLD PRIZE MONEY:** The Fair Directors and Superintendents reserve the right to withhold prize money from any exhibitors who fail to comply with any of these rules and regulations or who fail to report their 4-H projects for the current year to the 4-H Educator or Program Associate.
16. All livestock **MUST** remain on the grounds until excused by the Superintendent, Sunday, 6 pm.
17. Refer to specific rules for each species.
18. **NO BLUE JEANS** to be worn in the show ring. Dress: white collared shirt and tan or dark colored pants. (White pants can be worn in the Dairy Goat and Cattle classes.)
19. **Shirts must be long enough to be tucked in, no bare backs. No open toe shoes, flip flops or sandals can be worn when working with or around your animals at all times.**
20. If a 4-Her is showing more than one species at this fair, he or she must complete all of one species 4-H show before going into another.  
(Example: All of your working steer classes must be finished before leaving to do the beef show or vice versa.) You must be on time for the classes you are entering. Your Superintendent must be informed if you are entering more than one species.
21. Remember to put all your classes on your entry form. No late classes accepted. If you have a question, please call your 4-H leader or the Hillsborough County 4-H office at 603-641-6060.
22. Superintendents and Assistant Superintendents decisions are final.
23. Nothing can be attached or hung to the walls. No nails or staples. All educational displays and signs must be free standing.

**Grand Grand Champion Female** (First place winners from Classes 9 - 14)

**Class 15.** Market Steer or Heifer, born 1/1/08 - 7/31/08. Open to all beef breeds and beef crossbreeds.

**Class 16.** Feeder Steer or Heifer, born on or after 8/1/08 and must be four months old by Fair.

**Grand Champion Market Animal**, (First place winners from Classes 15 & 16. (Rosette)

**Class 17.** Herdsmanship: Based on neatness and cleanliness of animals, stalls, equipment and surrounding area, cooperation of exhibitor, promptness and courtesy to judge and public.

To be eligible you must have your animals housed in the Beef Section of the barn.

**Note: Stalls need to be cleaned & waste needs to be put in designated area before leaving the grounds.**

**If it is not done, you will lose your herds award and fit & show awards.**

**Awards for Fit and Show:** A: \$20; B: \$15; C: \$10

**Awards :** A: \$8; B: \$6; C: \$4.

Not more than one breed per exhibitor; one entry per class. All entries in group classes must have been shown in individual classes. All animals must be clean and fitted. All sheep must originate from a non-quarantined flock and animals must not have been exposed to Scrapie, Scabies, or any other contagious or infectious disease, and are not the direct progeny (first generation) of any animal diagnosed as having Scrapie. Any animal (as well as the flock) found to have foot rot, sore mouth, pink eye, or other contagious disease will be removed from the fairgrounds. Decision of the Superintendents will be final.

**Pens will be available on Thursday night. All 4-Hers and their families are asked to assist with the pen set-up which begins at 5 pm on Thursday. All animals will remain on the fairgrounds until 6 pm on Sunday. Pens will be dismantled prior to release.** The only exception to this is the Lamb Auction class, which may arrive on Sunday. Bedding is to be supplied by the entrant. Divider needed for Scrapie Program Sheep must also be supplied by the entrant. Paperwork must be checked by 9 pm on Friday. Leadline narrations must be turned in at that time.

Superintendent reserves the right to combine classes if less than three animals per class.

All sheep will be shown in halters. No coloring or covering of sheep. Entrant and sheep should compliment one another. Outfit may be purchased or sewn and must be at least 70% wool. Outfit will be judged on presentation and appropriateness to age. Member and sheep should promote both 4-H and the sheep industry.

## **Department 17 Fleece Judging & Sale**

**Class 1. Fleece Judging**

(This class is sponsored by Wild Thyme Farm, New Ipswich, NH) Open to all NH 4-H members. No pre-entry required, but must use a standard HCAF exhibitor tag. Fleeces will be displayed in the 4-H Exhibit (Hinton) Building and must be in place by 9 pm Friday night. (Can be dropped off anytime between Thursday 2 pm and Friday 9 pm.) Write the breed name on the exhibitor tag.

Fleeces will be judged by Jeff Jordan on Sunday, time to be announced. All fleeces should be well skirted and free of foreign matter as much as possible. They must be dry and presented rolled (but not tied) in a clear plastic bag. Fleeces will be offered for sale in the sheep tent area during the Market Lamb Show & Sale. Exhibitor is responsible for picking up his/her own fleece for the sale.

All entries will receive a ribbon. Judging based on Danish system.

Awards Best Overall Fleece: 1st: \$15; 2nd: \$10; 3rd: \$5

Awards Skirted Fleece: 1st: \$10; 2nd: \$6; 3rd: \$4

Entries limited to two per breed, per class and a total of eight animals per exhibitor. Base date for determining animal age will be the date of the show.

**Health Regulations:** All goats must originate from non-quarantined herds under state supervision and must be clinically free from all other infectious and communicable diseases including lymphadenitis, staphylococcal infection, foot rot, sore mouth, or scrapie and not be progeny of goats known to be infected with scrapie. **All animals will be checked by the Superintendent prior to being penned at the fair. Any animal showing any visible signs of illness will be asked to leave the grounds immediately. The Superintendent's decision is final.** No animals can be unloaded without permission of the Superintendent. Also see General Rules for additional health requirements.

All 4-Hers must show in the appropriate Fitting and Showing classes for their age. All animals used in Fitting and Showing classes must be shown in the appropriate breed classes or packing class. Failure to do so will result in lost premiums for both classes. It is not required that the same animal be used for both Fitting and Showing.

By breed, the first place winner for all classes will be immediately called back for selection of the Junior Champion Doe and Junior Reserve Champion.
