



ROCKINGHAM COUNTY 4-H FOUNDATION DWIGHT W. BROWN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP



A presentation of a \$750.00 scholarship from the Rockingham County 4-H Foundation will be made to 4-H alumni, who have been involved in the Rockingham County 4-H program of UNH Cooperative Extension. The scholarship is to recognize outstanding achievements in 4-H and to a community.

The requirements are:

- A) Must have completed at least three years of active membership in Rockingham County 4-H program of UNH Cooperative Extension.
- B) Must be currently enrolled in post secondary education.
- C) Be an active community member who has shown strength of character, citizenship, and leadership.
- D) Through 4-H participation has encouraged others by example to join and helped others to become more involved in 4-H.
- E) Scholarship money must be used for post secondary education at the applicant's choice of college. Preference will be given to 4-H members pursuing career goals related to 4-H projects.

Applicants must complete the Rockingham County 4-H scholarship application and submit a two to three page narrative on how 4-H made a difference in their lives, their favorite and most meaningful 4-H experience, and how they have and plan to make a difference through leadership and community service.

Applications must be postmarked by October 1, and mailed to Rockingham County 4-H, UNH Cooperative Extension, 113 North Road, Brentwood NH 03833-6623. The recipients will be selected by a volunteer committee of the Rockingham County 4-H Foundation and County Extension Educator, 4-H. The presentation of the scholarship will be made annually at the Rockingham County 4-H Recognition Night.

The Dwight W. Brown Memorial Scholarship is a living tribute to the personal spirit and commitment involving citizenship, community service, dedication to 4-H, and continuation of solid values. Dwight's life was surrounded by agriculture and strong family values, from spending his childhood working on his grandfather's farm in Epping, New Hampshire, to 33 years in the agriculture and farm machinery business. A childhood member of 4-H and later the founder of the first Rockingham County 4-H scholarship, Dwight consistently promoted the importance of 4-H through actions, thoughts, and deeds. It is only fitting that this special part of his life continue in support of 4-H and all that it means. This scholarship is awarded to the 4-H member who exhibits kindness of heart and spirit, responsibility for him/herself and others, and who through his/her participation in 4-H has encouraged others to join and share in its lessons.
