**ROCKINGHAM COUNTY 4-H
LYNN GARLAND'S LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP**



Presentations of \$1,000.00 scholarships from the Rockingham County 4-H Foundation will be made to 4-H alumni, who have been involved in the Rockingham County 4-H program of UNH Cooperative Extension. The requirements are:

- A) Must have completed at least five years of active membership in Rockingham County 4-H program of the UNH Cooperative Extension, participating in a variety of 4-H projects and programs at the local/club, county and state levels.
- B) Must have served in 4-H leadership roles contributing the behind the scenes work to help plan, organize and conduct successful 4-H programs and special events; **or** served as a 4-H junior or teen leader helping younger members while serving as a positive role model.
- C) Must have participated regularly in volunteer/community service activities.
- D) Must be currently enrolled in post secondary education as a sophomore, junior, senior or in graduate school. Preference will be given to 4-H members pursuing career goals related to 4-H projects.
- E) Scholarship money must be used for post secondary education at the applicant's choice of college or technical school.

Applicants must complete the following:

- 1. Rockingham County 4-H Scholarship application.
- 2. A two to three page narrative on how 4-H made a difference in their life, their favorite and most meaningful 4-H experiences, and how they have and plan to continue making a difference through leadership and community service.

The recipients will be selected by a volunteer committee of the Rockingham County 4-H Foundation and County Extension Educator, 4-H Youth Development. The presentation is usually made only once to a given 4-H alumni. A formal presentation of the scholarship will be made annually at the Rockingham County 4-H Recognition Night.

The Scholarship is named in honor of Lynn Garland who served for 39 years (1969-2008) as Extension Educator, 4-H Youth Development in Rockingham County and served as a 4-H volunteer leader in New Hampshire and Maryland. As a positive role model to many, Lynn encourages youth and volunteers to "Be your own self at your very best all the time"; to help others with an "I'll be glad to" positive attitude, and to develop their **Head, Heart, Hands, and Health to better living.**

Applications must be postmarked by October 1, and mailed to Rockingham County 4-H, UNH Cooperative Extension, 113 North Road, Brentwood NH 03833-6623. Good luck!
