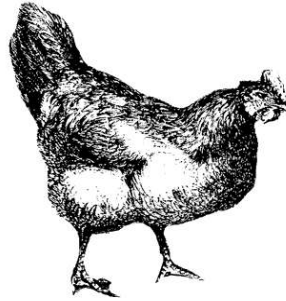



## General Rules

### Eligibility:

This show is open to 4-H members from Rockingham and Strafford, Counties. Youth must be at least 8 years old as of 1/1/11. Anyone who reached the age of 19 on or before January 1, 2011 is ineligible to exhibit.

### Entries:

All animals must be owned or leased on or before June 14, 2011. Please bring 4-H animal approval form (any animal being shown must be listed on this form), lease form, 4-H Youth Medical Treatment form, 4-H Youth Code of Conduct form, and State Veterinarian preformed Salmonella Pullorum Test result papers. The superintendent will check your animals and papers upon arrival. All animals must have legible leg bands, which must appear on the 4-H approval form, lease form, and State Vet test results under that identification. No animal will be permitted to be shown, if it has not been entered on the entry form or if it is without proper papers or leg band. All chickens must be solely owned by the 4-H member exhibiting them, unless leased, in which case the lease must be in the name of the 4-H exhibitor. Lease must conform to New Hampshire 4-H guidelines.

### Health Regulations:

All chickens must originate from a non-quarantined flock and must not have been exposed to Salmonella Pullorum, or Avian Influenza, or other contagious or infections diseases, and are not from direct progeny of any animal diagnosed as having Salmonella Pullorum or Avian Influenza. All animals must meet all of the current NH Dept. of Agriculture regulations.

All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified with a permanent leg band and free of visual evidence of infection, contagious or parasitic diseases at the time of arrival. Animals will be inspected by the superintendent before being unloaded. As per the state veterinarian's regulation, all chickens over 5 months of age must have been tested within 1 year for Salmonella Pullorum and Avian Influenza and passed. You will need to show certificates as proof of test.

**Birds under 5 months of age need official documentation (from where the bird was purchased or hatched) showing that the bird comes from a Salmonella Pullorum and Avian Influenza free flock. The superintendent has the right to refuse any bird or to send one home if showing signs of illness.**

### Show Attire:

Exhibitors must be neatly, cleanly and appropriately dressed for showing in all classes. Proper dress includes white shirts worn with solid colored slacks/pants. No blue jeans, shorts, skorts, skirts, farm or breed shirts permitted. Proper footwear required, *no open toed shoes at anytime during the fair.* No hats.

**Arrival:**

Animals may arrive at fairgrounds between 4 p.m. and 9:00 p.m., Wednesday night, 7/20/11 or come before 8 a.m., Thursday, 7/21/11 and remain until 6 p.m., Sunday, 7/24/11, or when dismissed by superintendents. All animals must be removed by 8 p.m. on Sunday. **Bring only animals that are to be shown!** Absolutely no vehicles may be parked on the fairgrounds. Animals and equipment are to be unloaded and vehicles parked in field outside the gate.

**Animal Care:**

Grain must be furnished by the exhibitor. Bedding will be provided by the fair. Exhibitors are expected to keep the areas around the animal exhibits and barn clean by putting all manure in the concrete manure pit. No small piles will be allowed behind animals. At the conclusion of the show, all exhibitors must clean their stall areas and put all manure in designated area. Farm sign may be included but are optional parts of overall pen/stall area decorations. Remember to bring your wheelbarrow, rake, shovel, feed and tack.

**Fitting & Show:**

All exhibitors must participate in appropriate fitting & show class. The animal used must be shown in its appropriate breed class.

**Showing:**

Exhibitors must show their own animal(s) except in the case of illness or emergency, when by permission of the show superintendent, it may be shown by another 4-H member. **No adult** will be allowed to assist with the preparation of an animal while on the grounds. After one warning, an exhibitor so assisted will be disqualified. Preparation of animal at home should be done by 4-H'er.

**Conduct:**

Rudeness at any time or unsportsmanlike behavior is unacceptable. Irresponsible behavior may result in disqualification, forfeiture of premium, or inability to exhibit in the future. There will be **no smoking** in the barns or ring area. The use of alcohol, illegal drugs, and fireworks is absolutely forbidden. 4-H members are the sole responsibility and under direct supervision of their parent or guardian.

**Breed Divisions**

Classes will be divided into Standard chicken feather foot, Standard chicken clean foot, and Bantam chicken feather foot, Bantam chickens clean foot.

**Costume Class:** Friday, 7 p.m. - will be for all species. If you intend to participate in this activity, please include your social security number on the entry form. Your legible, typed if possible, descriptive narration is due by noon to your superintendent. Costumes are judged on originality and creativity. The winners of individual species competition will receive a savings bond from Rockingham County 4-H Foundation.
