

Save the Date – Saturday October 23rd!

On October 23, 2010 we will be holding the Annual Fox Forest Field Day. RAIN OR SHINE!

The focus this year is on early successional and shrub-land wildlife habitat. From 9 am to noon there will be a demonstration of the Brown Brontosaurus as we do maintenance on the small block of shrub-land habitat adjacent to the parking lot at Fox headquarters. We will have hardhats and safety glasses



but if you have your own and can bring them that would be great! Fox Program Forester Inge Seaboyer (with 21 years of experience as the habitat forester for the Division of Forest & Lands South Region) will be joined by Dr Pamela Hunt, Avian Conservation Biologist for New Hampshire Audubon. Pam works

closely with NH Fish and Game implementing bird conservation across the state, including monitoring, research, and species assessment. She most recently authored NH's "State of the Birds" report, and is studying habitat use by early successional birds, particularly Whip-poor-wills. She and Inge will talk about this critical wildlife habitat type and answer questions.

At noon we'll fire up the grill. Hot Dogs, Chips and a drink will be available for \$3.00.
