



Upland Habitat Management Seminar

Hidden Valley Boy Scout Reservation

Gilmanton Iron Works, NH

Join wildlife biologist Grant Mecozzi, consulting forester Ron Klemarczyk, county extension forester Andy Fast, and New Hampshire Fish and Game's Chuck Miner for an exploration of upland habitat management. The program will consist of a 1 - 1½ hour indoor session followed by a 1 – 1½ hour field component. The indoor session will cover topics such as the land use history of New Hampshire, the role of natural resource professionals in land management, management options for maintaining forest health, how to attract wildlife to your property, Operation Land Share, as well as ways to fund habitat improvement projects on your land. The outdoor component will focus on the specific management strategies employed at the Hidden Valley Boy Scout Reservation. This is a great opportunity to have your questions answered by forestry and wildlife professionals.

Because there is a field component to this workshop that involves a hike, please bring boots, water, and be prepared for seasonal weather conditions.

Directions: Take Route 93 to Exit 20 to Route 140 toward Belmont, to Gilmanton and to Gimanton Iron Works. Turn left onto Crystal Lake Road before the Gilmanton Iron Works Village. From Crystal Lake Road turn right soon after turning onto Crystal Lake Road onto Mt. Road 1.2 miles at end of Mt. Road turn left onto Avery Hill Road. Follow road 2.4 miles and turn onto Places Mill Road. Hidden Valley Scout Reservation entrance is 0.9 miles on the right.
