



Upland Habitat Management Seminar

Join staff from the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), UNH Cooperative Extension and the National Wild Turkey Federation (NWTF) for an exploration of upland habitat management. Topics will include: A history of land use in New Hampshire, management options for maintaining forest health, how to attract wildlife to your property and ways to fund habitat improvement projects on your land. You will have an opportunity to view habitat management techniques on the property and have your questions answered by forestry and wildlife professionals.
