### Program fees and details:

In addition to resources and grant support, we provide a workshop for 10 or more participants like classroom teachers, school staff, parents, community members and students. The program consists of 4, 2.5-hr. training sessions, curriculum materials, fundraising ideas and ongoing technical support. Your group will receive 6 sets of internationally recognized and pilot-tested materials, including the award-winning curriculum guide, *Homes for Wildlife*.
