Directions to the Blake Family Tree Farm

From Concord:

Take I-89 west to exit 9 (Route 103). Follow Route 103 west for approximately 30 minutes till you reach Newport. Take a right onto Route 10 north and follow for 0.5 miles. Take a left onto Oak Street, Blake Tree Farm will be on your left in approximately 2 miles. Follow dirt driveway to the top of the hill.

From Hanover:

Take I-89 south to exit 13 (Route 10). Follow Route 10 south for approximately 10.5 miles to Newport. Take a right onto Oak Street, Blake Tree Farm will be on your left in approximately 2 miles. Follow dirt driveway to the top of the hill.

From Keene:

Take Route 10 north for approximately 32.5 miles to Newport. Take a left onto Oak Street, Blake Tree Farm will be on your left in approximately 2 miles. Follow dirt driveway to the top of the hill.

From Plymouth or Meredith:

From I-93 exit 23, follow Route 104 west through Bristol to Danbury, approximately 15 miles. Turn left on Rt. 4 ("east") and follow approximately 10 miles to Rt. 11. Turn west on Rt. 11 and follow approximately 8 miles to I-89. Take I-89 north one exit to exit 12. Continue on Rt. 11 west approximately 11 miles to Newport. Take a right onto Rt. 10 north and follow for 0.5 miles. Turn left onto Oak Street. Blake Tree Farm will be on your left in approximately 2 miles. Follow dirt driveway to the top of the hill.

About Tree Farm Field Day

The American Tree Farm System (ATFS) is a nationwide program that encourages private forest owners to actively manage their forests in a sustainable manner for multiple values. Launched in 1941, ATFS is the world's oldest sustainable forest and certification program. The system is managed by the American Forest Foundation and supported by 46 Tree Farm Committees with over 4,000 volunteer foresters.

Today, approximately 94,000 Tree Farmers manage 27 million acres of privately owned forestland nationwide and over 1,500 New Hampshire Tree Farms manage 500,000 acres of forestland in the Granite State. These landowners proudly display the familiar green and white Tree Farm sign signifying they are a part of the Tree Farm System.

In recognition of the efforts made by New Hampshire landowners who care about the management of our forests, the New Hampshire Tree Farm committee awards one outstanding Tree Farm the honor of Tree Farm of the Year.

Join us at the Blake Family Tree Farm to learn about the award winning techniques and principles that have been applied in managing this land. In addition to tours and lectures, many of New Hampshire's leading forestry authorities and organizations will be in attendance to answer your questions and provide you with information and resources that will benefit both you and your forest.
