Rural landowners of 10 or more acres can enroll their property in the state "Current Use" program and lower their property taxes. However, property enrolled in Current Use has restrictions on its use. Also a written management plan is required for forestland enrolled in the "stewardship" category.

We will also give an update on any changes to Current Use regulations. If your land is already in Current Use, this will be a good refresher for you.
