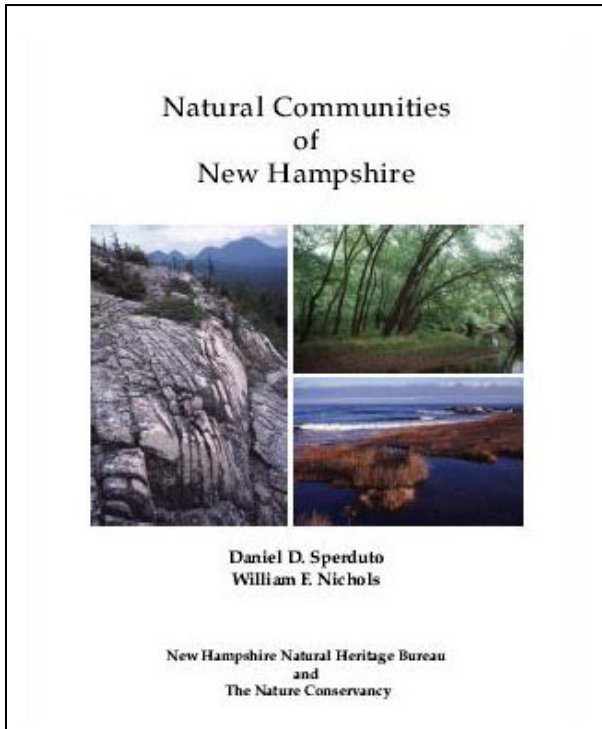


# Natural Communities of New Hampshire

This comprehensive manual represents the culmination of fifteen years of natural community classification work in New Hampshire.

The 230-page book describes 192 different types of natural communities, from “black spruce/balsam fir krummholz” high in the White Mountains to “black gum - red maple basin swamps” of the southeastern lowlands. It also includes an overview of important physical features and natural divisions of New Hampshire.
