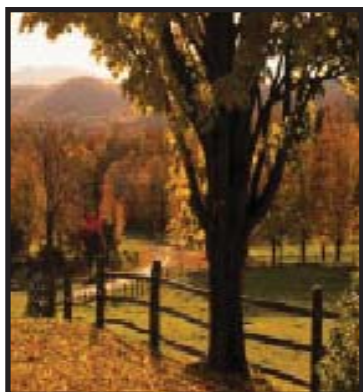


TREE FARM FIELD DAY



About Tree Farm Field Day

A Tree Farm is a privately owned forest managed to produce timber with added benefits of improved wildlife habitat, water quality, recreation, and scenic values.

Today, approximately 94,000 Tree Farmers manage 27 million acres of privately owned forestland nationwide and over 1,500 New Hampshire Tree Farms manage 500,000 acres of forestland in the Granite State. These landowners proudly display the familiar green and white Tree Farm sign signifying they are a part of the Tree Farm System.

In recognition of the efforts made by New Hampshire landowners who are about the management of our forests, the New Hampshire Tree Farm committee awards one outstanding Tree Farm the honor of Tree Farm of the Year.
