Spring is around the corner and soon the snow and ice will be melting and the wetlands of New Hampshire will once again come back to life. Vernal pools, marshes and shrub-wetlands have been identified in the New Hampshire Wildlife Action Plan as habitats in greatest need of conservation in New Hampshire.

Matt Tarr, UNH Cooperative Extension Wildlife Specialist, will conduct an indoor and outdoor session discussing ecology, identification and management of these habitats. The field portion of the workshop will involve visiting a known vernal pool to take a closer look at the habitat and wildlife using the site. Please come dressed for the field and have boots suitable for wet ground - Hip/chest waders are not required, but participants are encouraged to bring them.
