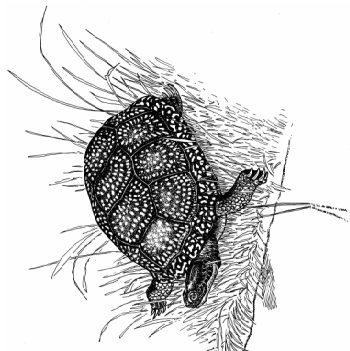

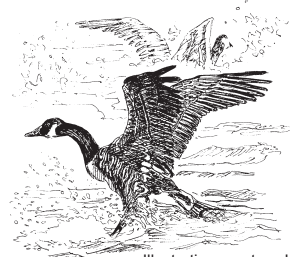

### Directions to the workshops:

**Directions to the Northwood Town Hall:**

**From the North, South and East:** Take Rte. 4 west from the Lee Circle (Rte. 125) for a distance of 11 miles. The Town Hall is on the right hand side of the road, less than 1/3 mile west of Northwood Meadows State Park.

**From the North, South and West:** From the Epsom Circle (Rte. 28) take Rte. 4 east for a distance of 8 miles. The Town Hall is on the left hand side of the road approximately 1/2 mile east of Coe-Brown Academy.

**Directions to Waste Management**

**From 125 N** - take a right at lights onto Rochester Neck Road. Go 0.4 miles to top of the hill. Take a left into Waste Management T.R.E.E. Training Facility and Heavy Equipment Maintenance area. Classroom is in the bright blue building on the left.

**From 125 S** - take a left at lights onto Rochester Neck Road. Go 0.4 miles to top of the hill. Take a left into Waste Management T.R.E.E. Training Facility and Heavy Equipment Maintenance area. Classroom is in the bright blue building on the left.

**Vernal Pools and Wetlands Wildlife: For landowners and professionals**  
Tuesday, May 4 - 12:30 – 4:00pm Waste Management, Rochester, NH

Vernal pools, marshes, and shrub-wetlands provide unique and important habitats for a variety of reptiles, amphibians, birds, and mammals. Through a combination of indoor and outdoor instruction we will compare and contrast these different wetland types and learn what wildlife species are associated with each. Participants will learn how to identify amphibian egg masses in the field and learn some basic techniques for determining what amphibians are breeding within a wetland. We will discuss methods for managing forested habitats near wetlands and how to avoid negative impacts to wetland habitats during timber harvesting activities. Bring waterproof boots and waders if you have them.

**Improving Your Forest For Wildlife: An introduction for landowners**

Designed for landowners and volunteers, this workshop will introduce a number of forest, field, and wetland habitat types. Participants will learn about specific components of habitat that are used to predict what wildlife species might be found on any parcel of land. Through classroom and outdoor instruction, we will provide examples of habitat improvement projects participants can use to enhance cover and foraging opportunities for mammals, birds, reptiles, and amphibians.

**Managing Fields & Shrublands for Wildlife: For landowners and professionals**

Hayfields, pastures, and fields overgrown provide critical habitat to a large variety of wildlife species in New Hampshire. Landowners have many options for providing habitat for wildlife in fields they manage for hay or livestock, as well as in fields that are just kept open through occasional mowing. Participants will learn how field acreage and the species and structure of plants growing in fields determines what wildlife species will use field habitats. We will introduce a variety of management techniques that can be used to attract and support different wildlife to fields of any size.
