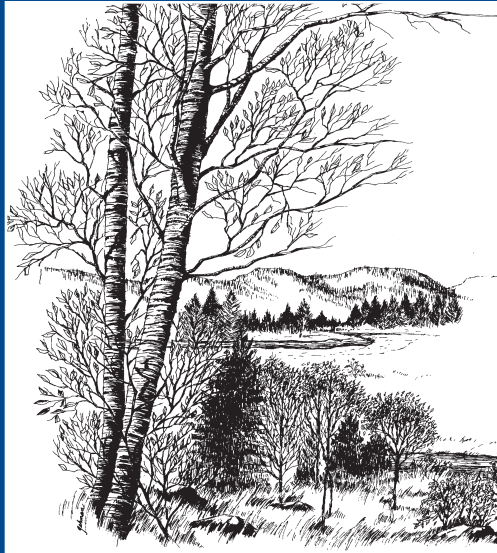

From Concord and Route I-93. Take exit 15E to merge onto I-393 E/US-202 E/US 4-E. Take exit 3 to Route 106 north. (Sheep Davis Road) Continue north on Route 106 approximately 12 miles. Ames Road is a left turn onto a dirt road. It is north of the Loudon International Speedway by just over 1 mile. Follow Ames Road to a parking area on the left.

From the North. From the junction of Routes 140 & 106 in Belmont, follow 106 south 5.1 miles. Ames Road is a right turn just past Rocky Pond. Follow Ames Road to a parking area on the left.

Parking is limited and carpooling is encouraged. Watch for signs.
