Stonewall Farm, Keene

Stonewall Farm is located just north of Route 9 West on Chesterfield Road in Keene, NH. (Unfortunately, both Mapquest and Yahoo believe we are south of Rt. 9.) Our address is Stonewall Farm, 242 Chesterfield Road, Keene, NH 03431.

From the North, South or East of Keene. From the T-intersection where Route 101 ends and Routes 9, 10 & 12 combine to bypass Keene, take Route 9 West (towards Brattleboro, VT) for three miles. A blue state sign bearing STONEWALL FARM's name will alert you to turn right onto Chesterfield Road. Follow Chesterfield Road for approximately one mile and turn right into the driveway at the bend in the road. Follow driveway to parking lot. The Sugarhouse and Learning Center will be in front of you.

Northern Forest Heritage Park, Berlin

Near the north end of the City of Berlin on Route 16 (Main St). The parking area is located on the east side of the road opposite 961 Main Street. Walk through the nearby pedestrian gate to the Bunkhouse meeting room. (Please call 752-7202 if you have any questions.)

Remick Museum, Tamworth

From Interstate 93: Take Exit 23 (New Hampton) and head east on Rte. 104 towards Meredith. Travel approx. 8 miles until you come to a stop light at Rte 3. Turn left (north) and travel approx. 1 mile to a stop light in town. Turn right (east) on Rte 25 for 15 miles to Rte 113. Turn left (east) on Rte 113 and drive 4/10 of a mile. Turn left (still on Rte. 113) and go about 2 miles to an intersection. You will see signs pointing left to the business district. Turn left at the intersection. The museum is on the right at the end of the village. It is the second house past the church.

From Route 16: Turn West onto Route 25. Go about 2.4 miles and turn right onto Rte 113 and drive 4/10 of a mile. Turn left (still on Rte 113) and drive about 2 miles to an intersection. You will see signs pointing left to the business district. Turn left at the intersection. The museum is on the right at the end of the village. It is the second house past the church.

Getting Started in Maple

Have you thought about making your own maple syrup? Do you want to know what is needed and learn how to do it? Attend this workshop if you do. It will cover all the steps from the tree to the table and plus the equipment needed. This special workshop is geared to first-timer and beginner maplers having less than 75 taps. All aspects of maple sugaring will be covered, including tree identification, tapping, collecting, boiling sap, finishing, filtering and packing syrup. Equipment and supplies needed, especially sizing and operating small evaporators, homemade and commercial, will also be discussed.

Speaker Information

This program is presented by Sumner Dole of the University of New Hampshire Cooperative Extension where he has been the Belknap County Forester for almost thirty years. He also specializes in maple. He has been making maple syrup in his own backyard with various systems for many years.
