

Directions to Wild Meadow Woods

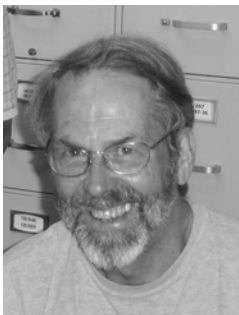
210 Bohonon Road

Danbury is the home of Ragged Mountain Ski Area, and can be reached from Route 4 or Route 104 from all directions.

From the Junction of Routes 4 and 104, in Danbury Center, take North Road behind the Danbury General Store, past the fire station and Grange Hall.

Go 2 miles until the road turns sharply left and take the sharp RIGHT onto Bohonon Road. Follow this dirt road about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile to the bottom of the hill where it crosses a brook. The drive to the cabin is on the left, just after the brook.

NH Coverts Cooperators, Friends & Family are invited to a snowshoe hike and picnic lunch at Wild Meadow Woods, the woodlot owned by Coverts volunteer Andy Powell (CC95) and his family, located in scenic Danbury, NH.



What you'll see & do

Participants are encouraged to wear snowshoes, though if you don't have any, you can probably follow along in boots behind others without sinking (hopefully!). We'll be accompanied by Merrimack County Extension Educator Tim Fleury, and consulting forester Shaun Lagueux, who works with the Powells on managing their tree farm.

We'll take a short hike on the extensive recreational trail network the Powell's have developed, visiting a forested wetland, several permanent wildlife openings created by a timber harvest in 2001, and managed forest areas showing the effects of forest management in a pine forest, with spruce-fir regeneration in the understory. We'll talk about wildlife habitat values, and hopefully see tracks.

Lunch will be BYO bag lunch, eaten back at the Powell's cabin. Dessert will be provided...Malin will bring chocolate chip cookies!

After lunch, you'll have the option of an additional hike up the steeper hills behind the cabin to the sugar bush, or a flatter hike along Wild Meadow Brook. Options for extended hikes will be available for intrepid hikers, along with maps of the property. Bathroom facilities are available.
