

MONITORING & MANAGEMENT CHECKLIST FOR AUGUST - SEPTEMBER

<u>PLANT</u>	<u>PEST</u>	<u>ACTION</u>
Andromeda	Andromeda Lacebug (last gen.)	Inspect underside of new growth for adults. Treat with registered pesticide if needed.
Cherry	White Prunicola Scale	Inspect for pale white crawlers on stems and leaves. Last chance to treat with registered pesticide if needed.
Crabapple	Eastern Tent Caterpillar	Examine branch tips for shiny black egg masses and remove.
Dogwood	Dogwood Borer Dogwood Sawfly	Inspect trunk and large branches for holes and fresh sawdust. Destroy by hand or treat with nematodes. Inspect leaves for clusters of larvae covered in white wax. Pick off infested leaves or treat with registered pesticide if needed.
Euonymus	Euonymus Scale	Inspect for red-orange crawlers on stems and leaves. Last chance to treat with registered pesticide if needed.
Hardwoods	Fall Webworm Japanese Beetle Two-Spotted Spider Mite	Check tip leaves for eggs and larvae. Prune or treat with reg. pesticide. Too late for B.T.. Examine leaves for adults and skeletonizing. Treat with registered pesticide if needed. Strike branch on white surface. Check for white mites.
Hemlock	Hemlock Woolly Adelgid	Inspect for masses of white wax at base of needles. Coverage and follow-up vigilance critical.
Honeylocust	Honeylocust Mite	Shake branch over white surface. Look for reddish-brown mites and treat with registered pesticide if needed.
Larch	Larch Casebearer	Inspect needles for tip browning and young cases. Treat with registered pesticide if needed.
Oak	Oak Skeletonizer	2nd Gen. Too late for B.T. Larvae vulnerable to other registered insecticides until they begin dropping.
Pine (soft)	White Pine Aphid	Inspect for black eggs on needles. Remove infested needles if few or treat with soap or oil.
Rhododendron	Rhododendron Borer	Inspect large lower branches for holes and fresh sawdust. Destroy by hand or treat with nematodes.
Spruce	Eastern Spruce Gall Adelgid	Inspect green galls at base of new growth. Treat with registered pesticide if needed and galls are open.
