**LEARN HOW TO HELP YOURSELF AND OTHERS GROW THEIR OWN FOOD**

According to the National Gardening Association there will be 700 million new vegetable gardeners this year. This means that there is a huge opportunity for Master Gardeners to share their knowledge and help new gardeners learn how to grow their own food. With this in mind, we'll tour the greenhouses, organic food production gardens and farm stand at Stonewall Farm in Keene. Viewing in mid-season is a great way to see techniques you may want to adopt in your own garden. We'll also learn how to help fellow gardeners answer the questions: Where should my garden be located? How large should it be? What should I grow? How many seeds and/or transplants do I really need? How do I start my plants from seed? Where is the best place to get supplies? How do I prepare the soil, plant, fertilize, weed, water and harvest? You'll leave with all the materials you need to answer these questions for yourself and others.

**ENFIELD SHAKER MUSEUM AND HERB GARDEN TOUR-**

The Enfield Shaker Museum herb garden was established in 1987 by Happy Griffiths, Museum Herbalist. Its present size is 70' X 88' with 12 beds (Medicinal, Dye, Culinary, Fragrant, Lavender and Everlasting) representing the herbs the Shakers grew. Annual herbs and everlasting flowers are grown in the adjacent garden. Seven different kinds of basil are planted along with other annual herbs, everlasting flowers, heirloom vegetables and broom corn.

The Shakers called this area the "Chosen Vale" and used their herbs for many purposes including culinary, medicinal and for dye. The Shaker Museum runs a Village Gardeners Program May-Oct and teaches all aspects of herb gardening. We will take a tour of the Great Stone Dwelling House, the largest stone building built by the Shakers in the mid 1800's and learn about the Shakers' way of life and the seasonal activities in the garden. Happy will lead a tour of the herb gardens, discuss heirloom seeds and give us a special hands-on workshop with herbs. Lunch is included in the admission cost.

There will be plenty of time after the tour and workshop to browse thru the Museum gift shop. A map is available for a self guided tour of other buildings and shops on the site.
