2010 Pesticide License Training for Private Pesticide Applicators in Hillsborough County

Date: Mondays March 8, 15, and 22 training March 29 - Exam
Time: 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.
Where: UNH CE Hillsborough County Office, Goffstown, NH

Do you use or supervise the use of pesticides for producing an agricultural commodity on property owned or rented by you or your employer?

If you answered "yes," the State of New Hampshire requires you to have a private applicator's pesticide license. UNH Cooperative Extension will be conducting a three-part training session for individuals who are not presently certified to apply pesticides and those whose private applicator licenses have expired due to lack of required re-certification credits.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

- * Any farmer who intends to use Restricted Use pesticides and is not presently certified.
- * Anyone working on farm and is intending to apply Restricted or General use pesticides (any pesticide) in the course of employment.
- * Or an individual already certified by the NH Department of Agriculture, Division of Pesticide Control but have not earned their required re-certification credits and who is planning on retesting for certification.

This training is free; although participants will need to purchase a manual in order to study for the state exam and **you will need this manual to take the training.** To order your study materials, contact Rachel Maccini, Pesticide Safety Education Program Coordinator at (603)629-9494 ext. 130 or email <rachel.maccini@unh.edu>

As you might expect, both for the protection of the public and employees in the building, the Bouchard Building is now considered a "secure" facility. When you visit Cooperative Extension or any of the offices located in the building between 8 am and 4 pm or attend a night meeting, you will be greeted in the lobby by a Sheriff's Bailiff. You will be asked to remove any metal objects from your person, they will inspect any bags you bring into the building, and you will then walk through a metal detector. If metal objects are detected, a "wand" will be used to help locate the objects(s). The equipment is sensitive and will detect jewelry, coins, metal zippers, etc. The process is similar to airport security. Please, do not bring jack knives, leatherman tools, etc.

From the North and South: Take Route I-93 to I-293 to the exit for Route 101 West. Go to the large set of lights in Bedford (101 turns left), go straight toward Goffstown. You are now on Route 114.

From the East and West: Take Route 101 to the large intersection with Route 114 in Bedford. Take Rt. 114 West toward Goffstown.

All Directions: From Routes 101/114 intersection (near Bedford Fire/Police Station and the Farm Credit Office), take Route 114 West through three (3) sets of lights. Turn west (left) at the next set of lights (4th set) on Route 114 West. Travel about 1/4 mile and look for the Hillsborough County Complex. Take a right into the first driveway and park to the left or right. If you go past the Women's State Prison, you have gone too far.
