
Directions to the Field Crop Meetings

- **November 3, 2009:**
Bath Congregational Church, 6W Bath Road, Bath, NH:
From the Concord Area: Take I-93 North to Littleton, NH. Take exit 42 and turn left onto Main Street/US 302/NH 10/18. Go 15.9 miles and the church is on the right. Maps will show that the church is at the intersection of Rte 302 and W. Bath Road but it is not clearly marked. If you pass the Bath Fire Station on your left, you have gone too far.
- **November 4, 2009:**
Webster Town Hall, 945 Battle Street, Webster, NH:
From the Concord Area: Take I-93 to Exit 17. Bear right and go through the center of Boscawen past the Dunkin Donuts, Black Forest Nursery, and Quik Mart. When you come to the fork in the road, bear to the left onto Route 4. Stay on Route 4 until you come to a blinking yellow light at the Junction of Route 4 and Route 127. Bear left onto Route 127. You will see the Webster Town Hall on the right side of Route 127 after going a few miles.
- **November 5, 2009:**
Stuart & John's Sugarhouse, 19 Rte 63, Westmoreland, NH:
From the Concord Area: Take I-89 to Exit 5 (US Rte 202/ Rte 9W) heading towards Henniker/Keene. Continue on Rte 9. Take 12N ramp toward Walpole, NH. Merge onto NH-12. Turn left onto NH-63. The Sugarhouse is on the left.
