From the South:

Take Route 93 North to Exit 15E, Route 393 East. Take Exit 3, Route 106 North. Take a left off the exit. Continue north on Route 106 for 6.6 miles and turn left at Shaker Road. Proceed 3 miles, go through Shaker Village and continue another ¼ mile to reach North Family Farm on the right behind the brick house.

From the North:

Take Route 93 South to exit 18 and follow signs approximately 7 miles to Canterbury Shaker Village. Continue another ¼ mile to reach North Family Farm on the right behind the brick house.

From Laconia/Lakes Region:

Take Route 106 south approximately 15 miles. Turn right at Shaker Road. Proceed 3 miles, go through Shaker Village and continue another ¼ mile to reach North Family Farm on the right behind the brick house.

From the East:

Take Route 4 West. Merge onto Route 393 West towards Concord, NH. Take Exit 3, Route 106 North. Take a right off the exit. Continue north on Route 106 for 6.6 miles. Turn left at Shaker Road. Proceed 3 miles, go through Shaker Village and continue another ¼ mile to reach North Family Farm on the right behind the brick house.

About Tree Farm Field Day

The American Tree Farm System (ATFS) is a nationwide program that encourages private forest owners to actively manage their forests in a sustainable manner for multiple values. Launched in 1941, ATFS is the world's oldest sustainable forest and certification program. The system is managed by the American Forest Foundation and supported by 46 Tree Farm Committees with over 4,000 volunteer foresters.

Today, approximately 95,000 Tree Farmers manage 26 million acres of privately owned forestland nationwide and more than 1,450 NH Tree Farmers manage 500,000 acres of forestland in the Granite State. These landowners proudly display the familiar green and white Tree Farm sign signifying they are a part of the Tree Farm System.

In recognition of the efforts made by New Hampshire landowners who care about the management of our forests, the New Hampshire Tree Farm committee awards one outstanding Tree Farm the honor of the Outstanding Tree Farm of the Year.

Join us at the North Family Tree Farm to learn about the award winning techniques and principles that have been applied in managing this land. In addition to tours and lectures, many of New Hampshire's leading forestry authorities and organizations will be in attendance to answer your questions and provide you with information and resources that will benefit both you and your forest.
