**Directions to North Haverhill Town Hall:**  
Parking is limited. There are spaces at the town hall, along the roadside and in back of the town hall at the Legion ball field.

**From Interstate 91:** take exit 17 to Wells River, Rte. 302 to Woodsville, Rt. 10 south 4 miles to the town of North Haverhill. You will pass Aldrich's Store and gas on the right. In ½ mile the entrance to the town hall is on the right, directly across from Patten's Sporting Goods (big yellow sign).

**From I-93 and parts south and east.** Take I-93 to Plymouth, Exit 26 to route 25 towards Rumney and head west approximately 35 miles. At the route 10 intersection take a right on Route 10 and travel 5 miles north into the town of North Haverhill. Continue straight at the rte. 116 intersection and Black Mount Equipment will be on your right (John Deere). Just past Blackmount on the left is the entrance to the town hall, directly across from Patten's Sporting Goods.

**From the north** follow route 302 south to Woodsville. Get on Route 10 south at the intersection (Wal-Mart on the right). Go 4 miles south on route 10 to the town of North Haverhill. You will pass Aldrich's Store and gas on the right. In ½ mile the entrance to the town hall is on the right, directly across from Patten's Sporting Goods (big yellow sign).

**Deer Management Workshop:** Forestry operations have a huge impact, both positive and negative, on deer habitat. It is particularly important to make conscious management decisions when cutting timber in and around deer wintering areas and yet there are locations in New Hampshire where deer densities are very high, and regeneration of quality tree species can be a major challenge for landowners and foresters. This workshop is geared towards foresters and landowners to help them understand the importance of the decisions made when working in deer yards. We will also discuss and look at situations where deer densities are too high and what can be done to establish regeneration. It is important to see the situation from both sides of the coin. Presentations will be given by biologists and foresters from UNH Cooperative Extension, NH Fish and Game Dept. and a private consulting forester to look at what can be done to benefit the overall health of our forest resources.
