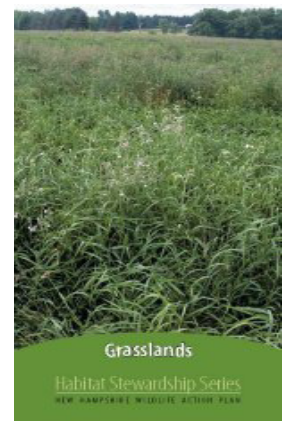
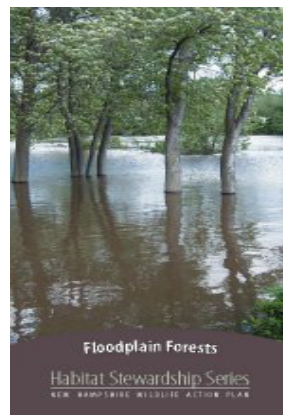
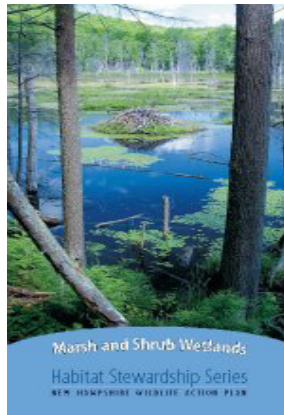
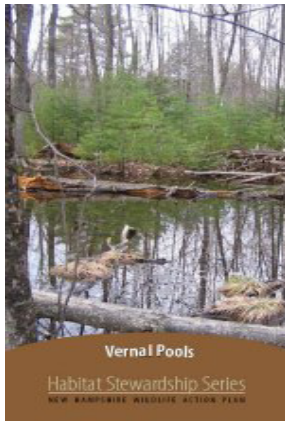
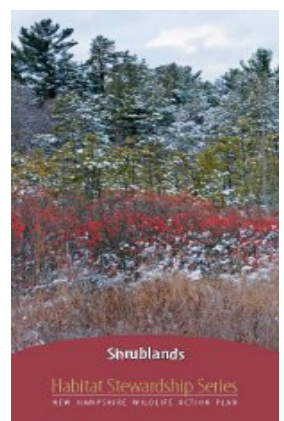
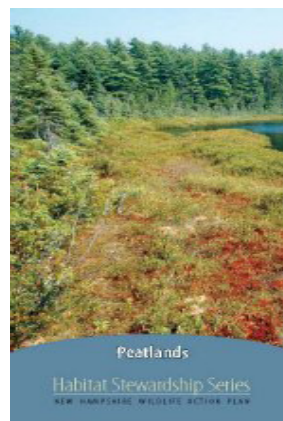
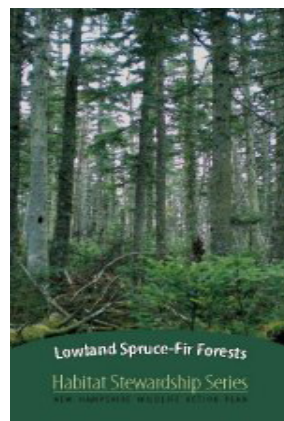
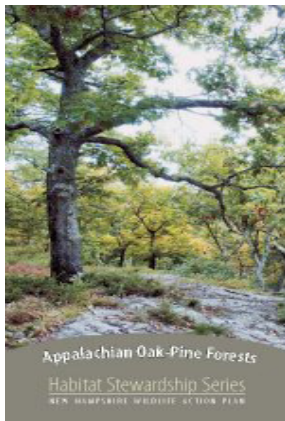


DO YOU RECOGNIZE IMPORTANT WILDLIFE HABITAT WHEN YOU SEE IT?



Habitat Stewardship Brochures: These colorful brochures include practical information for landowners interested in managing their land to help wildlife in New Hampshire. Pictures and text help identify habitats and wildlife species, and provide management guidance for each habitat. **Habitats include:** vernal pools, marsh and shrub wetlands, floodplain forests, grasslands, Appalachian oak-pine forests, lowland spruce-fir forests, peatlands, shrublands and (new in 2011) hemlock-hardwood-pine forests, headwater streams, northern hardwood-conifer forests, and shorelines.
