

Proper recovery systems will need to be explored and designed including parachutes, and streamers.

Visit this museum with more than 700 permanent, hands-on exhibits enhanced by stage presentations and science interpreters offering one-on-one challenges. This workshop has an additional fee of \$20. Minimum 15 people.

Boston's Freedom Trail & Faneuil Hall Marketplace

Visit this historical city and walk into history on the paths that the early settlers walked when this country was just an outpost. After lunch you will spend the afternoon exploring Faneuil Hall Marketplace which is actually four great places in one location – Faneuil Hall, Quincy Market, North Market and South Market, all set around a cobblestone promenade where jugglers, magicians, and musicians entertain the passers-by. So join us for a fun day exploring, eating, shopping, and appreciating this captivating city.

Equine Science

Presented by Sarah Hamilton, Director, UNH Equine Program If horses are your thing this workshop is a must! Spend the day at the



UNH equine facility. You will start with a tour and learn about feed management, bandaging and wound care. Find out what makes a good cross country course and get an insight into career opportunities in the equine industry. You will also get an overview of the academic components of the UNH Equine program.

Lights, Camera, Action!

big tank will allow you to get closer than you ever thought possible! After you have explored the Aquarium you will spend the afternoon exploring Faneuil Hall Marketplace with the cobblestone promenade where jugglers, magicians, and musicians entertain the passers-by. This workshop has an additional fee of \$10. Minimum 15 people.
