Develop an Online Food Safety Education Program for Poultry & Rabbit Processors

Currently, UNH Cooperative Extension is the sole provider of a food safety education program required for poultry/rabbit producers to be certified to sell their uninspected product to restaurants in New Hampshire. To make the program more accessible to processors, we are developing an online program similar to the in-person program which is implemented twice a year.

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Undergraduate students enrolled in a degree program at the University of New Hampshire with an interest in developing online education programs. Students who have experience in video editing and an interest in learning more about local food systems are encouraged to apply.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist with videography (filming and still photos) in a variety of locations in NH including on-farm settings.
- Ability to edit video.
- Assist with videography.
- Ability to work as a member of a work team and contribute creative suggestions and ideas, for example, how to best shoot a segment and sequencing of information.
- Ability to work independently to accomplish project tasks.
- Participate in UNH Cooperative Extension summer internship meetings and events.
- Timely reporting of hours and mileage.
- Students must supply their own transportation to UNH and/or county offices and field sites when needed (mileage reimbursable).

TIMING AND FUNDING

This internship spans a 10-week period between late May and August 2016 (the exact timing is negotiable) with an anticipated 30-hour work week. The successful candidate will receive \$10/hour with a maximum of 300 total hours.
