

Field Meeting DOUBLE CROPPING FOR DAIRY FEED PRODUCTION

Monday, May 23, 2016 12 to 1:30 p.m.

UNH Cooperative Extension is collaborating with UNH researchers on an NRCS funded field trial that is assessing the viability of double cropping systems for production of feed for dairy cattle. In double cropping systems, a cover crop is planted in the fall and then harvested in the spring for feed before a summer annual is planted. This use of double cropping not only provides the benefits of a cover crop, but it also can increase the total yield from cropland.

Adam Crete of Highway View Farm participated in the two year trial. He then expanded from the two acre trial to planting 60 acres for double cropping.
