Who Should Attend:

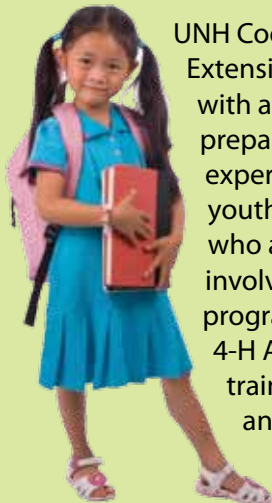
- Direct service staff working with youth in afterschool programs (K-12).
