Zoysiagrass

We have received many inquiries about zoysiagrass for lawn purposes. Advertising which has created this interest has ranged from fair to misleading. It is not a miracle grass as some advertising would lead you to believe. It is a southern grass that we do not generally recommend for use in New Hampshire.

Here are some of its advantages and disadvantages.

Advantages of zoysiagrass

- 1. Zoysiagrass grows especially well during the hot summer months.
- 2. When established, it produces a thick, dense, cushiony turf.
- 3. Its thick growth prevents and, therefore, controls crabgrass and summer weeds.
- 4. It has a good green color during the hot summer months when the cool season grasses may become unattractive.
- 5. It withstands close moving ($\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches).
- 6. It grows in most types of soil with proper management.
- 7. It withstands wear and tear during the summer.
- 8. It can survive severe heat stress.
- 9. It tolerates low fertility once it is well established.
- 10. It requires less water than most cool-season turf grasses.

Disadvantages of zoysiagrass

- 1. It loses its green color and becomes brown and straw colored about mid-October. It remains this color until about mid-May. In contrast, cool-season grasses usually have good green color about 8 months or longer.
- 2. Propagation by vegetative establishment, with stolons or sod plugs, is necessary. This method tends to be expen sive and laborious. Seed is generally unavailable and impractical.
- 3. Zoysiagrass establishes slowly. Under ideal conditions, it may give cover in one season. Normally, 2 to 3 years is required.
- 4. Winter annual weeds tend to be more of a problem in zoysiagrass than in cool-season turf.
- 5. Once established, it is difficult to eliminate and may be a nuisance around plant beds.
- 6. Injury from heavy winter traffic, while zoysiagrass is dormant, can be severe.
- 7. When brown and straw colored, it is flammable and may be a fire hazard when allowed to grow tall near wooden buildings.
- 8. Since it is tough and grows densely, it requires more regular mowing in summer.
- 9. While it tends to have less disease than most turfgrasses, it is subject to rust and fairy ring. Fusarium blight has caused serious problems on occasion.
- 10. It is not satisfactory for shade.
