"I have done a lot in 4-H but one thing changed my life. In the past years, I have participated in demonstration and public speaking and each time it gets easier because I am not as afraid as I was my first year in 4-H. When I first noticed this, I was on a cruise coming back from Bermuda in the middle of April. The cruise ship was holding a karaoke competition, but normally I wouldn't participate because I would be too afraid. Then I thought about how it's easy when I get up and do a demonstration or a public speech at 4-H. At that moment I realized how 4-H helps to build my confidence. When the time came, I got up and sang and realized it was surprisingly easy and a lot of fun. After I completed my song, the people clapped and cheered and I knew I had done well."

10 years old

15 years old

I collected adult worn gently used clothes and blankets for the homeless which attended a breakfast at Veterans Park in Manchester and a dinner at Everett arena in Concord. I collected 44 large garbage bags from 20 different families. At the end of the winter almost all the clothes were gone. The clothes that remained were given to a local thrift store for a credit towards more clothes for next season. The homeless people appreciated the donations which kept them warm last winter. I learned that a lot of people are willing to donate to the homeless and I also learned how good it feels to help others."
