# Is it Asian longhorned beetle or not?

# **ALB!** This is an Asian longhorned beetle.

Note the long, striped antennae and the white spots on its back.



# **NOT!** This is a white-spotted sawyer.

Note the one white spot at the base of its head. The ALB doesn't have a spot there.

# **NOT!** This is a western conifer seed bug.

The antennae of the western conifer seed bug are much shorter and not “striped” like ALB. The body is various shades of brown with a distinct geometric pattern on the wings. The last segment of the back legs is flared.

# **NOT!** This is a [broad-necked root borer](#).

The antennae are much shorter than the ALB's antennae, and are not striped. The body is solid black, with no white spots.

# **NOT!** This is an eyed click beetle.

The antennae (not seen here) are much shorter than the ALB's antennae. The body is speckled with white spots, and there are two large black "eye spots."

# **NOT!** This is a [brown prionid](#).

The antennae are shorter than the ALB's antennae, and are not striped.  
The body is light chestnut brown, with no spots.

# **NOT!** This is a [northeastern sawyer](#).

The antennae are long, like the ALB's antennae, but they are not striped. The body is mottled light brown, with no distinctive spots.

# **NOT!** This is a [banded longhorned beetle](#).

The antennae are long, like the ALB's antennae, and they are striped. The body is dark with gray or light brown mottling. There is a prominent protrusion at the rear of the abdomen.
