Education: Please submit an unofficial transcript of your undergraduate work and any graduate work completed to date.

Eligibility: A candidate must be a graduate student in a field related to community development, economic development, planning, public policy, natural resources stewardship, and/or youth and family development. The student must also be available to work in the Durham vicinity, unless the particular project or activity is explicitly located elsewhere.

Schedule: Fellows will work with UNH Cooperative Extension and partner organizations to arrange for a flexible work schedule. Fellows are expected to work at least 300 hours during the term of the Fellowship.

Application Deadlines: Applications are due by March 15, 2016.

Security Screening: UNH Cooperative Extension may have to conduct a background check of selected Fellows.

Expectations: Fellows are expected to dress and conduct themselves in a professional manner. Inappropriate behavior may be grounds for dismissal.
