



2017 Summer 4-H Quilt Camp Week I: July 10-14 - Week II: July 31-Aug. 4 Week III: Aug. 21-25

Welcome to the 4-H Summer Quilt Camp. Get ready for a week of friendship, hard work and fun. By the end of your week you will have a completed your own beautiful quilt to keep or give to someone special. Details are below, you will need to choose a pattern, pick out and purchase materials. Read though the quilt patterns to help choose, the materials will help you purchase the right amount. If you have questions about the patterns or purchasing materials feel free to call the 4-H office 447-3834 or you may call Dotty directly if you have specific questions.

Remember, by attending the 4-H Summer Quilt Camp you are also committing to help sew the quilt for the 4-H Quilt Raffle at the Sandwich Fair. You will need to commit a total of nine hours spread out over the three days of the fair, October 7-9. Quilters have a great time during the Fair in the 4-H Exhibit Hall working on the quilt and talking to fair goers about 4-H and the quilt.

Your Day At 4-H Summer Quilt Camp

The Quilt Camp will be held at the Sandwich Fairgrounds in the Smith & Hodges exhibit buildings.

Please arrive between 8:00 - 8:30

Be sure to Bring

- All the fabric and materials for your quilt
- Lunch each day, Dotty will have snacks
- Warm clothes, these buildings can be chilly in the mornings and on rainy days
- A swim suit, in case it gets hot and you need to play under the sprinkler for a bit

Pick up is at 5:00 pm

Selecting A Pattern

This is the fun part. As you consider a pattern, be sure to take your ability into account. First year quilters must choose from Trip Around the World, Log Cabin or Single Irish Chain. Returning quilters may also choose from additional patterns or call Dotty, they have other patterns they would like to try. Remember some patterns such as the Log Cabin have several variations that create a variety of different designs.

TRIP AROUND THE WORLD



Twin sized Bedspread quilt:

- <u>Body</u> 1 yard each of 6 different fabrics.
- Border From that 6, choose your most favorite and get an extra 1 ³/₄ yards for the outside border. Choose your second most favorite and get an extra 1 ¹/₂ yards for the middle border. Choose your third most favorite and get 1 extra yard or the inside border.
- Backing For the backing, get 6 yards of fabric or two twin sized flat sheets that coordinate with the colors in your quilt.
- <u>Batting</u> You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like a really puffy quilt, get more than one bat, up to three.
- ThreadGet 8 skeins of coordinating embroidery floss for tying the quilt. Get two large spools of thread that
coordinate with your fabric. If you have trouble matching your fabric, get gray thread.

Double sized Bedspread quilt:

<u>Body</u>	1 yard of 7 different fabrics.
Border	From that 7, choose your most favorite and get an extra 2 yards for the outside border. Choose your second most favorite and get an extra 1 ½ yards for the middle border. Choose your third most favorite and get 1 ¼ extra yards for the inside border.
Backing	For the backing, get 8 yards of fabric or two twin sized flat sheets that coordinate with the colors in your quilt.
<u>Batting</u>	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like a really puffy quilt, get more than one bat, up to three.
Thread	Get 10 skeins of coordinating embroidery floss for tying the quilt. Get two large spools of thread that coordinate with your fabric for sewing. If you have trouble matching your fabric, get gray thread.

Queen sized Bedspread quilt:

<u>Body</u>	1 yard of 8 different fabrics.
Border	From that 8, choose your most favorite and get an extra 2 1/4 yards for the outside border. Choose your second most favorite and get an extra 1 3/4 yards for the middle border. Choose your third most favorite and get 1 1/4 extra yards for the inside border.
Backing_	For the backing, get 8 $1/2$ yards of fabric or two twin sized flat sheets that coordinate with the colors in your quilt.
Batting	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like a really puffy quilt, get more than one bat, up to three.
Thread	Get 10 skeins of coordinating embroidery floss for tying the quilt. Get two large spools of thread that coordinate with your fabric. If you have trouble matching your fabric, get gray thread.

LOG CABIN QUILTS

Twin sized Bedspread quilt: (good for first year quilters)



<u>Body</u>	18 Squares Center square - ¼ yard Light Colors first light - ½ yard, second light - ¾ yard, third light - 7/8 yard. Dark Colors first dark - ¾ yard, second dark - 1 yard, third dark - 1 ¼ yards.
Border	Third most favorite – 1 ¼ yards Second most favorite – 1 ¾ yards Most favorite – 2/12 yards
<u>Batting</u>	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one bat up to three.
Backing	7 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards of fabric or two twin sized flat sheets – 100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
<u>Thread</u>	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 8 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

Double Bedspread sized quilt

Body Border	24 Squares Center Square – ¼ yard <u>Light Colors</u> first light – ½ yard, second light – 7/8 yard, Third light – 1 ¼ yards <u>Dark Colors</u> first dark – ¾ yard, second dark – 1 yard, third dark – 1 ½ yard. Third most favorite – 1 ¼ yards Second most favorite – 1 ¾ yards Most favorite – 2/12 yards
<u>Batting</u>	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one bat up to three.
Backing	10 ¹ / ₂ yards of fabric or two twin sized flat sheets-100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
Thread	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 10 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.
Queen sized Bedspread quilt: 24 Squares	
Body	24 Squares.

	<u>Light Colors</u> first light – $\frac{1}{2}$ yard, second light – $\frac{3}{4}$ yard, third light – $\frac{7}{8}$ yard
	Dark Colors first color $-\frac{3}{4}$ yard, second dark -1 yard, third dark $-1\frac{1}{4}$ yard
<u>Border</u>	Fourth most favorite -1 ¹ / ₄ yards
	Third most favorite -1.34 yards
	Second most favorite $-21/4$ yards
	Most favorite – 3 yards
Batting	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one bat, up to three.
Backing	7 ¹ / ₂ yards of fabric or two twin sized flat sheets–100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
Thread	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 8 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

SINGLE IRISH CHAIN



Twin sized Bedspread quilt:

Body	Fabric #1 – background – 4 ¼ yards Fabric #2 – chain – 1 ¼ yards
<u>Border</u>	 # 1 – 7/8 yard / This can coordinate or contrast with other fabrics in your quilt top. It will be the first frame of your quilt, if you think of your quilt like a picture in a frame. #2 – 1 ¾ yards / This can be the same fabrics as your chain fabric or as your background. It can be something totally different, but needs to coordinate and compliment your quilt.
Backing-	For the Backing get 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards fabric, or two twin sized flat sheets – 100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
Batting-	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one bat, up to three.
<u>Thread</u>	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 8 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

Double/queen sized bedspread quilt:

<u>Body</u>	Fabric #1- background – 5 ½ yards Fabric #2 – chain – 1 ½ yards
Border	 # 1 – 1 ½ yards / This can coordinate or contrast with other fabrics in your quilt top. It will be the first frame of your quilt, if you think of your quilt like a picture in a frame. # 2 – 2 yards / This can be the same fabrics as your chain fabric or as your background. It can be something totally different, but needs to coordinate and compliment your quilt.
Backing	8 yards fabric, or two twin sized flat sheets-100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
Batting	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like a really puffy quilt, get more than one bat, up to three.
Thread:	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 10 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

DOUBLE IRISH CHAIN BEDSPREAD SIZED QUILT Advanced Quilters Only

Twin sized bedspread sized quilt:

<u>Body</u>	Fabric #1 – Background 2 ³ ⁄ ₄ yards Fabric # 2 – Center chain 1 ¹ ⁄ ₄ yards Fabric # 3 – Outer chain 2 yards
<u>Border</u>	 # 1 – 1yard / May be one of the two chain fabrics, or may be a complimentary or contrasting color to act as a frame. # 2 – 2 yards / May be one of the other fabrics used in the quilt to tie it all together, or it may be a complimentary fabric.
Backing	6 ¹ / ₂ yards or two twin sized flat sheets–100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
<u>Batting</u> - bat,	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one up to three.
<u>Thread</u>	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 10 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

Double/queen sized quilt:

<u>Body</u>	Fabric #1 – Background 3 ¹ / ₂ yards Fabric # 2 – Center chain 1 ¹ / ₂ yards Fabric # 3 – Outer chain 2 ¹ / ₂ yards
Border_	 1 - 1 ¹/₂ yards / May be one of the two chain fabrics, or may be a complimentary or contrasting color to act as a frame. 2 - 2 yards / May be one of the other fabrics used in the quilt to tie it all together, or it may be a complimentary fabric.
Backing-	8 yards or two twin sized flat sheets-100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
<u>Batting</u> - bat,	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one up to three.
<u>Thread</u>	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 10 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

Twin or double sized quilt



Double/queen sized bedspread quilt:

<u>Body</u>	Fabric #1- background – 5 ½ yards Fabric #2 – chain – 1 ½ yards Fabric #3—corners of snowball squares—1 ¼ yards.
<u>Border</u>	 # 1 – 1 ½ yards / This can coordinate or contrast with other fabrics in your quilt top. It will be the first frame of your quilt, if you think of your quilt like a picture in a frame. # 2 – 2 yards / This can be the same fabrics as your chain fabric or as your background. Or it can be something totally different, but needs to coordinate and compliment your quilt.
Backing	8 yards fabric, or two twin sized flat sheets-100% cotton at least two hundred thread count.
Batting	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like a really puffy quilt, get more than one bat, up to three.
Thread:	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 10 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.

FLYING GEESE QUILT Advanced Quilters Only



Twin or double sized quilt

<u>Body</u>	 1/3 yard each of 6 different calicos (mediums and darks) 2 yards light calico 2 1/4 yards striped fabric or fabric of choice for lattice 1 yard first border 1 ½ yards second border 2 ½ yards third border
Backing	7 yards fabric or 2 twin sized sheets-100% cotton at least 200 thread count
<u>Batting</u>	You will need one king sized quilt bat. If you like really puffy quilts, get more than one bat, up to three.
Thread	Two large spools of thread to coordinate with fabric. 10 skeins of embroidery floss to tie quilt. Make sure it coordinates with fabric.
