Session 1

Envision Berwick

Envision Berwick is a group of Berwick, Maine community members who join together with local people to celebrate Berwick as a rural, riverside town that appreciates the importance of a connected, actively engaged community and proudly cultivates its unique strengths and small town character. The group works to promote small business and creative outlets where local talent, entrepreneurship, and agriculture flourish; foster a healthy relationship with land and river through conservation, environmentally-minded development, substantial and functional green space, & responsible recreation; and create a safe, friendly downtown where youth, families and community come together.

James Bellissimo is the current Chair of Envision Berwick, he was a member of the Downtown Vision Committee and is also the current Chair of Livable Berwick, an age-friendly subcommittee of Envision Berwick.

Ruth Bleau is an artist at the Vibe Art Gallery, and a member of the Livable Berwick and Recreation Master Plan subcommittees.

Pat Boisvert, a former teacher in town, has been part of the Downtown Vision Committee and Envision Berwick. She is now on the Preserving Heritage Committee and the Livable Berwick Committee.
