How to Apply:

Club: Each club can nominate up to three individuals each year.

Independent Members: Independent members may be nominated by their mentor. Each mentor can nominate up to three members each year.

All nominations are due to the county 4-H Office by July 1.

All applications will be reviewed by a committee and a final recipient will be chosen. The award winner will be announced at Honors Evening and will receive a personalized award certificate, a copy of “*I Dare You!*” William H. Danforth’s classic motivational book, and an invitation to join other young leaders at the National Leadership Conference.
