## FAQ for Extension Master Gardener Training

#### When and how often do you provide Master Gardener training?

We usually offer two core Master Gardener training sessions each year, one beginning late August and one in February. Based on demand and our available resources, we may be able to add sessions. If you are interested in taking the training but cannot attend one of our scheduled sessions, <u>please complete this survey</u>.

### Do you have classes in locations other than Goffstown in the spring and Concord in the fall?

Goffstown and Concord are our standard locations. We typically schedule the Goffstown class in the spring and the Concord class in the fall. We have offered classes in Portsmouth and Littleton and will consider these and other locations and times, if we have the resources and adequate demand.

#### Do you ever do the classes on weekends or evenings or at other locations?

The Littleton class has been in the evenings and the Portsmouth class in the afternoon. Again, this is something we will consider based on resources and demand.

#### Can I apply for the NH Master Gardener program if I live in another state?

Yes, if you will commit to completing your internship of 55 volunteer hours in New Hampshire.

### Can I transfer my Master Gardener certification from another state?

Yes, we accept Master Gardener certification from other states. If you are transferring from state other than in the Northeast, we would like you to attend our Master Gardener training sessions to acquaint you with our growing zones, soil and other subjects particular to New Hampshire. These classes are complimentary.

#### What do Master Gardeners do? How can I volunteer?

Master Gardeners assist and educate home gardeners throughout the state with horticulture, conservation and homerelated questions. They work at the UNH Cooperative Extension Infoline in Goffstown by answering questions by phone and email; provide education and complete projects in their communities including establishing school and community gardens; host presentations for the Master Gardener Speakers Bureau for community groups and organizations on a variety of topics such as seed-starting, composting and pest management in the garden and so much more!

## What if I do not have time or want to volunteer but would like to take the training?

If space is available you can attend as a certificate student and pay the full unsubsidized fee of \$500.

## Do you have online classes?

We currently do not offer online training.

## How much does the training cost?

\$250 plus \$25 for the Master Gardener handbook. We offer financial aid and scholarships foi

## What if I cannot afford to pay the tuition?

We offer financial assistance, payment plans and some garden clubs provide full scholarships.

## How long is the training?

Sessions are for 12 weeks, one day a week usually from 9-4pm.

# What will I learn in the class i.e. which gardening subjects will be covered?
