IN THE COMMUNITIES WE SERVE

County Impact Examples

Two UNH student interns engaged with the Town of Wolfeboro to assess opportunities to strengthen Main Street businesses by better linking trails and other natural assets to the downtown.



Forestry and Wildlife staff advised 184 woodlot owners, resulting in improved management on 6,346 acres of forestland. Water quality was monitored at 122 lake sites in Carroll County.

(603) 862-1520 Open: M-F, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. 21 farms or other agricultural businesses received on-site support from Extension specialists in topics including crop production, marketing, pest management and soil health. 76 workers were trained in safe food handling.



In Carroll County, 61 volunteers gave 5,707 volunteer hours to 4-H and other programs equaling 3 full-time employees. 92% of 4-H STEM participants learned new Science skills and 95% of 4-H Healthy Living participants reported an increase knowledge of healthier foods.


Technical assistance and planning support was provided to **31** New Hampshire towns.

Our 4-H, Resiliency, STEM Education, and Healthy Living programs work at three levels to achieve real impact: (1) we work directly with youth and family members to teach valuable skills, (2) we train volunteers and educators to work effectively with youth, and (3) we provide technical assistance to schools and organizations to build systems of support.
