#### **4-H QUALIFYING SHOW RULES AND ENTRY INFORMATION**

- 1. <u>ELIGIBILITY</u>: Enrolled 4-H members in Hillsborough County who are at least 10 years, but no more than 18 years, of age as of January 1, 2019, are eligible to compete for a place on the Hillsborough County team to the NH State Horse Show.
- 2. <u>HOW TO ENTER</u>: All horses must have been enrolled as a 4-H project prior to April 1, 2019 for those 4-H exhibitors trying for Eastern States; or prior to May 1, 2019 for all other horses. Only horses identified on their intent to show forms will be allowed to show with a 4-H exhibitor. **NO EXCEPTIONS**!
- **3.** <u>**HOW TO ENTER:**</u> Each 4-H exhibitor is to submit all of the following, complete with all exhibitors, 4-H Leader and parent/guardian signatures. These completed entry forms should be sent to:
  - Hannah Greenhalge, 51 Donald Street, Manchester, NH, 03102 postmarked by May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Late or incomplete entries will not be eligible to compete at the State 4-H Horse Show.

Each entry packet must include:

- A. Horse show entry form (two pages) signed by exhibitor, owner, parent/guardian and 4-H Leader (not applicable for independent members)
- B. An exhibitor must have an Intent to Show Form (or online version) completed by April 1 for ESE eligibility -THERE IS NO DEADLINE OR REQUIREMENT FOR THE STATE SHOW
- C. Photocopy of 2019 lease agreement (if applicable)
- D. Photocopy of negative Coggins for horses stabled out-of-state
- 4. <u>SHOWING:</u> Each 4-H exhibitor is allowed to participate in only one division for purposes of qualifying for the State Show. The specified divisions are: Western, English, Saddle Seat, In-Hand, Gymkhana, Driving and for a second year- Novice or Open Walk-trot; indicate your division on the entry form.
- 5. <u>PROPER APPOINTMENTS AND TACK:</u> Refer to the current 4-H rulebook.
- 6. <u>**RESPONSIBILITIES:**</u> The 4-H exhibitor is solely responsible for the preparation of the horse at this show. Irresponsible behavior on the part of the exhibitor and/or parent/guardian, leader, friends, etc. will result in disqualification of the exhibitor.
- 7. <u>THE TWO MINUTE GATE CALL WILL BE IN PLACE.</u> Exhibitors will not be allowed in the ring once the gate is closed.
- 8. <u>**RIDING CLASSES:**</u> Classes will be divided or combined at the discretion of management. All persons must wear approved ASTM/SEI helmet whenever mounted on a horse. Anyone under the age of 8 years cannot be mounted on a horse.
- 9. <u>IN HAND DISCIPLINE:</u> Open to all horses. Will be divided under 12 hands and 12.1 hands and over if sufficient entries. To be shown at the walk and trot. Judge may ask for any of the following commands: walk, extended walk, trot, extended trot, side-pass, back along the rail, stand, halt, reverse at any gate, or any other command as the judge deems fit. For additional details please reference the NH Supplement to the NE 4-H Horse Show Rule and Guidelines Issued March 18, 2015.
- **10.** <u>QUALIFYING EXHIBITORS:</u> 4-H exhibitors who qualify to go to State must accept or pass their spot by the end of the Qualifying show. It is at the discretion of show management whether a qualifying exhibitor may not continue to the state show for safety reasons.
- 11. <u>STABLE MANAGERS:</u> *NEW FOR 2019-* 10-11 year-old Stable Managers are allowed to join their county at the State Show. Stable managers must be accompanied by a parent or designated adult on the grounds for the entire duration of the show. This adult is NOT to be the county head chaperone, unless that head chaperone is the parent or guardian of the 10-11-year-old Stable Manager.
- 12. <u>QUIZ:</u> Created from the 4-H Horse Project NH 4-H Horse Project Member's Manual ONLY. <u>Quiz will be</u> take-home and provided to exhibitors and stable manager candidates by June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Completed quizzes need to be turned in at check-in on the day of the show, otherwise exhibitors will receive a score of 0 (zero).
- **13.** <u>JUDGING</u>: A photo judging class created from a selection of previously judged horses will be sent with the test-The completed placings must be turned in at check-in the day of show along with quiz.
- 14. <u>CONTINUED FOR 2019</u>: Horse sharing <u>will</u> be allowed at the 2019 State Horse Show. If both riders are showing in the same division, there may be limitations to which classes may be chosen and/or one member may need to show in a different division (IE both Juniors but one will need to ride Hunt Seat and one Western)

#### **Qualifying Horse Show Entry Form**

There will be \$10 entry fee per rider for 2019 entry. Checks can be made out to HCHC (Hillsborough County Horse Council)

\*Novice Walk-Trot is for riders not ready to canter in a group show setting, Open Walk-Trot is for riders choosing to ride in the walktrot division for any reason except being novice; it is not open to novice riders. Readiness form must be completed in State Show entry packet in order to compete at State Show.

Any exhibitors that qualify for the State Show <u>must</u> fill out their entry form for the state show before leaving for the day, including any entry fees that may be due.

# **\*\*\*IMPORTANT NOTES TO REMEMBER\*\*\***

It is extremely important that at least one parent or guardian be present at the completion of the show day. Those who qualify for the State Horse Show will meet with the coordinator, Joanne Gelinas, to go over important information and sign paperwork, which needs to be sent out immediately following the show. The exhibitor is solely responsible for completing paperwork on time.

All paperwork sent in, with the exception of the required photographs, **MUST** be a **PHOTOCOPY**. <u>**PLEASE**</u> <u>**DO NOT**</u> give us your originals, as you may not get them back.

You must enter at least two (2) performance classes, but no more than three (3), appropriate to your seat and division. If you choose three performance classes, only your best two performance scores will count toward your final score. There is no penalty for only choosing two, but both scores will count towards your total score.

There will be NO food booth the day of the show due to the limited size of the show. Please be prepared with breakfast, lunch, snacks as needed, and plenty of drinks and water!

Check-in at the secretary's booth for all exhibitors will begin at 7:30am and will end at 8:15am. Fitting and showmanship will start promptly at 8:30am, followed by the judging element of the event.

## QUALIFICATION FOR THE NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE 4-H HORSE SHOW – DEERFIELD FAIRGROUNDS

### July 12-14, 2019

Qualification for the State 4-H Show will be based on the total points accumulated as outlined below. Exhibitors will be ranked from highest to lowest point totals for the day. Those going to the State competition will be selected from the top of the list, named in descending order until such time when all available slots are filled. Exhibitors going to the State Horse Show must be at least 12 years of age or older as of January 1, 2019 (10 for stable managers).

Judging	100 points
Equitation	100 points

\*\*In the case of a tie between competitors for State Horse Show qualification, the highest combined points of the Quiz and Fitting & Showmanship will be the determining factor.

#### **DIVISIONS**

**SCORING:** 

Walk-Trot – *Novice* is for riders not ready to canter in a group show setting, *Open Walk-Trot* is for riders choosing to ride in the walk-trot division for any reason except being novice; it is not open to novice riders. *Readiness form must be completed in State Show entry packet in order to compete at State Show.* 

Junior – Riders age 8-13 inclusive as of January 1, 2019.

Senior - Riders age 14-18 inclusive as of January 1, 2019.
