The New Hampshire 4-H Hippology Contest is a comprehensive, skill-based competition where youth demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of equine science and horse husbandry through written tests, skill stations and horse judging. The 2021 event will be virtual via emailed materials.

AGE DIVISIONS (as of 1/1/21):

- Cloverbuds (non-competitive) age 5-7 (reading help and/or a scribe is encouraged)
- > Juniors age 8-10 (reading help and/or a scribe is encouraged)
- Intermediates age 11-13
- Seniors age 14-18

ENTRY FEE: The entry fee is waived for 2021, due to lower costs for a virtual event.
