


Asclepias tuberosa Butterfly Milkweed



The leaves and stems are covered with short dense hairs.





Unlike many other milkweeds, *Asclepias tuberosa* does not exude a milky sap when broken.



Leaves are long and narrow and

pairs along the

are borne in

thin stems.

Leaves closest to the tips of stems may take on an alternate leaf arrangement as the plant matures.



leaves with prominent

central veins.

Many short stems develop with clusters of orangle flowers on the tips of each.



Asclepias tuberosa is a lowgrowing plant with many short flowering stems.
