
Licensing Basics in New Hampshire

Firm NHPC Number Insurance Supervisory License Holder Operational License Holder



All pesticide applicator companies (Firms) must have at least one Supervisory License holder in the category(ies) they are doing business in. The minimum age for an applicator is 18 years old.

If there is a break in this chain there are consequences. All licenses have the Firm name and NHPC number on them. When a license is obtained it is connected directly to that Firm, NHPC number and insurance.

If the insurance is discontinued all licenses are revoked.

If a Supervisory license holder leaves the firm and there is no other Supervisory license holder for that firm then that license is revoked along with all of the operational license holders underneath him/her.

If an Operational license holder leaves the firm that license is revoked.

If an applicator leaves one firm for another the license is revoked, a new application is made out and signed by the Supervisory license holder for the new firm, along with the \$20 fee. Once received by the Division a new license (license number changes) is issued under the new firm and its NHPC number.

Additional Info: Licenses are renewed yearly at the end of the calendar year. However, a certified applicator has until June 1 of the following year to renew without retesting. There is also a five-year recertification timeframe. At the end of that five-year timeframe each certified applicator needs 12 continuing education credits per category in order to renew their license without retesting. The year of recertification is listed within a license number. For example: S-1517629 or O-1317630
