Twenty-five individuals will be chosen from the list of applicants to attend the spring workshop scheduled for May 15-18, 2019. The workshop will be held at the Barbara C. Harris Conference Center in Greenfield, New Hampshire. Accepted applicants pay a \$50 registration fee to secure their spot in the workshop, with all other costs – including food, lodging, and materials – funded by program sponsors. The workshop offers you an opportunity to get to know and to work with natural resource professionals and other volunteers from around the state. It will be fun, educational, and you'll become part of a volunteer network that will keep in touch through newsletters, field tours and future workshops.

Since 1995, over 500 people from throughout New Hampshire have completed the workshop and become Coverts volunteers. These volunteers have returned to their communities and hosted tours on their property, conserved land, presented wildlife programs, joined conservation commissions, written articles for newspapers and magazines, staffed exhibits, initiated natural resource inventories, worked on community conservation projects, and much more.
