Kevin Evans is the Director of Woodlands for Dartmouth College's 40,000 acres of timberlands. He has managed these lands for twenty-four years through major changes in the forest landscape, forest products industry, and multiple college administrations. Before that he was a consulting forester with a wide range of clients, and managed the Vermont woodlands of Diamond International before their land sale in 1988. The primary property of Dartmouth is the 27,000 acre Second College Grant owned by the College since 1807.

Kevin's responsibilities include harvesting a sustainable level of timber, resource planning, facilitating various research projects, managing data information systems, and care of the physical infrastructure of the property including 72 miles of roads to support recreational, research, and forest management activities. Kevin keeps the College's Green Certification updated, and spends considerable time educating college students and other visitors about forest products and management.

He especially enjoys special projects such as use of Grant wood on campus projects (dorm furniture) and wildlife population monitoring (specific research on fish, moose, and turtle). Kevin has a B.S. in Forest Management from the University of New Hampshire, and has professional forester licenses in the states of Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont. He lives in northern New Hampshire with his wife and two children.
