The Community and Economic Development Team continues to provide guidance to economic development leaders in Cheshire County on strategies for expanding broadband access to underserved areas.



Forestry and Wildlife staff advised 107 woodlot owners, resulting in improved management on 14,866 acres of forestland. Staff provided technical assistance to 23 communities in Cheshire County.



County Impact Examples

47 local farmers attended workshops to learn strategies for sustainable management of forage fields, including weed management, cover cropping, and soil health. The InfoLine answered 113 home and garden questions from county residents.



In Cheshire County, 90 volunteers gave 11,468 volunteer hours to 4-H and other programs equaling 6 full-time employees. 92% of 4-H Youth Leadership team members led projects in their community that made a difference and 96% of Youth Mental Health First Aid participants reported increased confidence in their ability to address youth mental health issues.


Technical assistance and planning support was provided to **31** New Hampshire towns.

UNH PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT & TRAINING (PD & T)
