FOREST MARKET REPORT

1948-1949

INTRODUCTION

Woodland owners and operators are anxious to know the forest market outlook for the winter cutting season of 1948-1949. Any prediction of market trends during this period must be qualified to allow for unforeseen changes in the market. If prices, generally, should level off or drop during the winter cutting season of 1948-1949, prices paid for forest products are likely to take the same course. The woodland owner who grows timber as a crop and markets some of his forest products each year establishes a yearly income from his woodlands during good and bad times.

It is interesting to note that in price studies made by the United States Forest Service, that though the actual prices paid for standing timber increased in periods of inflation and dropped during periods of deflation and economic depression, the adjusted price trend has risen steadily since 1900.

Tree growing is just as much a business as growing apples and other products of the soil. It isn't enough that wood is needed. The wise woodland owner wants to know more than that. He needs to know where he can sell forest products to good advantage. He needs to know what he must do to supply buyers, how much wood he can grow, what it will cost, and how much money he can make. So, one of the first things for him to do is to study the markets for wood. A wise farmer does this for his crops. He knows there is more to farming than good soil and good methods. He grows certain crops, not only because his land can produce them, but also because he can sell them. The same thing is true of crops of trees. Markets for wood differ widely from place to place, but it is often surprising how many markets there are.

Here is an actual case of a woodland owner in the town of Shelburne. Ralph I. Peabody, a 73-year-old farmer, has been managing his 95-acre woodlot for 31 years. Year after year, he selects the trees to cut, and sells the products from his woods for lumber and pulpwood; and he cuts his own fuelwood from poor-quality hardwood. Today, he has better and more trees on his woodlot than grew there 31 years ago. Each year he gets a good income from his 95-acre woodlot.

Mr. Peabody's gross income for his 1947-48 winter's work in his woods was as follows:

Not every owner of a small woodland will have as good a market, but similar opportunities - some greater and some fewer - are available to most owners, if all the merchantable material has not been cut.

* PRESENT MARKET SITUATION FOR FOREST PRODUCTS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

Lumber, pulpwood paper, and other forest products rode upon the general inflationary trend during most of the past year, with some slight but temporary price reversals.

Demand still absorbs about all the really good lumber being produced though poorly manufactured, improperly seasoned lumber, particularly in the lower grades, has met increasingly rough going ever since last spring. Dealers continue to avoid accumulation of large inventories, and New England retail lumber stocks have declined substantially since last March. Buyers are exerting pressure to insure that shipments conform with orders, and the day when anything could be sold at almost any price, if it remotely resembled lumber, is apparently over.

Present conditions (during September, 1948) can best be characterized as indefinite. Demand for lumber has slackened but the implication is obscured by the normal seasonal downward trend in demand as the construction season tapers off. West Coast shipments have fallen off, probably largely because of the stevedores' strike in that area. Boston stocks of Douglas fir are extremely low. Prices of some southern and northeastern lumber items have stiffened somewhat in recent weeks. Mortgage financing has been more difficult recently; this has had some tendency to slow down the rate of construction. Some liberal phases of federal housing legislation may offset this to some extent during next year's construction season.

The pulp and paper industry has entered a period of more normal conditions. Over-all demand has leveled off and supplies of most grades, except newsprint, are currently meeting market needs. Most manufacturers of newsprint advanced their prices \$4.00 per ton on August 1. New England paper and paperboard production in June 1948 was 2.5 per cent above June, 1947, and employment was up 2 per cent.

Some dullness has been observed in the woodpulp market, most noticeable with respect to imported pulp for which high prices were being asked for until very recently. This is not expected to develop into real weakness in the foreseeable future, though Scandinavian producers have recently lowered their prices to levels competitive with domestic prices. Some New England pulp mills have curtailed pulpwood purchases because of currently ample mill inventories. No curtailment of pulp manufacture is anticipated, however, so the outlook is merely for a return to a more normal pulpwood market.

Price resistance caused some uncertainty in the furniture business around mid-1948 but the industry is now back in stride on a high volume production level. Many veneer and plywood manufacturers are shaking the bushes to obtain enough veneer-grade logs and bolts to support full-scale operation of their plants.

Though the public's backlog of war and post-war savings is not diminishing there is growing reluctance to spend such savings. Nevertheless, the demand for durable goods is still heavy and appears to be promised strong support for many months to come.

Government defense purchasing, the Economic Cooperation Administration program, and industry expansion and modernization are significant factors in the appraisal of the 1949 economic situation.

Barring unforeseeable changes in the general economic picture, the outlook is for continued demand for New England stumpage. Some dullness may develop locally, particularly where timber stands can produce low grade lumber only and where pulp mill wood inventories are on the high side. There is little evidence at present that indicates any considerable change in the general level of New England stumpage prices either upward or downward during the coming winter operating period.

The 1948-49 Forest Market Report is an attempt to bring to woodland owners, buyers, mill operators, and owners of wood-using industries information on current prices paid for forest products, operating costs, and other pertinent information relative to the marketing of stumpage and forest products and a list of forest buyers by counties. *A fair method of determining stumpage values for a tract of timber is to compute the total cost of the operation (cutting, yarding), add about 20 per cent for profit and risk and deduct the whole from the going roadside prices.

It is extremely difficult to list a range of prices paid for forest products. Quality, quantity, location, logging chance, demand, and other factors affect prices paid. The range in prices paid for hardwood stumpage, roadside, and mill deliveries is so varied that the prices quoted are not of much importance. The quality of hardwood varies greatly from a general poor quality in southern New Hampshire to a variation of poor and good quality in northern New Hampshire. Veneer-grade logs of first quality bring an excellent price delivered at some of the veneer mills in northern New England.

The general specifications for veneer logs are as follows: 15 inches at the small end, no visible defects, at least 8 feet in length, straight and round, ends must be sawn square.

Buyers are demanding better quality logs this fall in comparison with one year ago. In many sections it may be difficult to sell the poorer quality stumpage or logs.

* At present pulp mills have a large inventory of wood on hand. Pulpwood buyers are purchasing only limited amounts of new wood during the 1948-49 season. A woodland owner should not start cutting pulpwood without first having an assured market for his wood. Woodland owners who plan to cut pulpwood are urged to contact their County Forester and get recommendations for cutting in accordance with good forestry practices.

LOG RULES AND GRADES

Log Rules generally used are the New Hampshire or Blodgett Rule, which is the legal rule for New Hampshire unless otherwise agreed to by both parties in writing. The International Log Rule is used by a number of buyers. It gives higher values for large straight logs of little taper than does the Blodgett Rule. The Blodgett Rule is favored by those selling small "pasture pine" logs that have excessive taper. The Keene Cord Rule is used in the Keene area. Roughly, $1\frac{1}{2}$ cords is equivalent to 1000 board feet, depending upon the quality and size of the logs. Along the Vermont border the Vermont Rule is used in a few communities as the Holland or Bangor Log Rule is occasionally used along the Maine border.

For information about Log Rules consult the County Forester.

Few companies or individuals purchase logs by grade other than to establish a price based on average log-run quality -- good, medium, and poor. More attention is now being given to lumber grades as the trade becomes more exacting in relating the grade of lumber to the price paid.

As the policy of selling and buying lumber by grade becomes more common, those having logs for sale may need to give attention to selling logs graded according to their quality. A few companies are already buying logs on grade, especially hardwood. The company that buys logs on grade will usually furnish the specifications upon request.

OWNER OPERATION OF WOODLANDS

Woodland owners who have merchantable timber ready for market should consider harvesting it themselves, especially when they have teams or tractors which can be used. Farmers can make productive use of farm equipment and labor during slack periods. The woodland owner who can get out his own logs can realize both the stumpage value and the price that would be paid for woods labor. He also has the advantage of being able to cut just the mature timber and so keep the younger growth coming along for later cutting, thus realizing a more continuous income from his forest land.

ASSISTANCE RENDERED BY THE COUNTY FORESTER

County Foresters will assist woodland owners in the examination of their woodlands. They will also make recommendations for managing woodlands.

County Foresters will offer advice to woodland owners on markets for forest products.

In order to teach woodland owners how to harvest timber so as to insure continued crops of trees, the County Forester will help woodland owners or their representatives to mark trees for cutting. They will advise woodland owners on other forest problems.

*LISTS OF FOREST PRODUCTS BUYERS

Names of buyers listed in this bulletin are those who have indicated to the County Foresters that they are in the market now or at a later date to purchase stumpage, logs, pulpwood, bolts, excelsior wood and other forest products. In contacting forest products buyers and operators, it was found that a majority would consider elective cutting - - - provided there was sufficient volume of timber on the lot to make it worthwhile to set a mill or carry on a logging operation. Owners can well consider giving options for future cuts to operators who will make partial cuttings in stands operated according to good forest management.

The pulp industry at the present time (fall 1948) has a full inventory of wood on hand, and will purchase little wood during the fall and winter months. A farmer or operator should not start cutting pulpwood unless he has a contract with a pulpwood buyer. The pulp industry demands good quality and preparation of wood for pulp. General specifications: knots cut even with surface of stick, 4-inch minimum diameter inside bark at the small end, 4-foot lengths, ends sawed square. Nothing allowed for overlength or scarfs. Rotten and burned wood, forks, or large burls are not acceptable.
