Jeff Smith Grows Trees for Profit

The Story of Jeff Smith, Hollis, N. H.

JEFF SMITH, a successful dairy and tree farmer, has found that growing annual crops of forest products is a profitable part of his farm business. The record of Mr. Smith's forestry operations over a period of years is a demonstration of what an enterprising man can do with his farm woodlands.

The Smith farm consists of 250 acres; 100 in hay and 150 in woodland. He milks about 30 Guernseys, has 20 young stock, a registered bull, 800 laying hens, and a horse. His equipment includes a field hay baler, hay chopper, two farm-all tractors, and a one-man power saw. He employs one full-time man, and another whenever needed. Mr. Smith acquired this farm in the early twenties and immediately began to follow good forestry practices in his woodlands. His records show that during the past 14 years sales from fuelwood, pulpwood, and lumber averaged about \$750 each year. In addition, he produces all the lumber and fuel used on his farm. Apart from all of this, the total value of the farm has been increased owing to the better quality and vigor of the trees throughout his woodlands.

Work in the woods adds very little extra cost to his farm operation. Mr. Smith uses equipment and labor for woods work which otherwise would be idle. He never neglects the rest of his business. Between chores, he and his hired man work in the woods during the winter months. Altogether, they get in about two man-months of woods work each year. Last year's harvest of about 30 cords of fuelwood, 11 cords of pulpwood, and over 10,000 board feet of white pine logs, was quite typical.

Although cash returns from forest products amounted to less than 10 per cent of Mr. Smith's gross farm income, they are in reality much more important than that. Almost all of the income from forest products is profit or labor income; much of the cash received from milk and eggs must be paid out again for feed, fertilizer, and other items.

Jeff Smith has managed his woodlands for 25 years. He recognizes that for maximum returns the same care must be given forest crops as to agriculture ones. He practices weeding, thinning, and pruning where and when needed, thus maintaining his forest in a high state of cultivation. The Smith farm lies in a region where the soils are well suited for growing pine. Since white pine is valuable and fast growing, Jeff has centered his woodland management around this tree.

Forest Market Report 1952

The Forest Market Situation*

PRICES OF forest products, with the exception of stumpage and Christmas trees, are regulated under a general price control order. This order established ceilings on prices paid between December 19, 1950, and January 25, 1951. Since enactment of the general ceiling price regulation, specific dollars and cents ceilings have been determined on some items such as pulpwood. It is the responsibility of buyers and sellers of forest products to determine whether they are within limits of OPS ceiling prices.

During the past year markets for forest products have been active. Lumber and pulpwood prices have remained near the ceiling levels. Stumpage prices, however, have advanced somewhat, reflecting a general trend of increasing stumpage prices. This trend results from a continuously expanding demand for forest products, a sharply limited supply of marketable trees, and a growing recognition by forest owners that their stumpage returns should cover the costs of growing a new timber crop.

The market situation promises to remain about the same during the coming year. Defense orders and the high level of all business activity should keep up the demand for forest products; on the other hand restrictions on credit for building and price controls should prevent excessive price increases. Any predictions of market trends must be qualified to allow for unforeseen economic developments.

Anyone planning to cut logs or pulpwood during the coming year should carefully consider the high cost and scarcity of woods labor. Woodland owners, especially farmers who are in the position to do so, should get out their own logs, pulpwood, or other forest products and sell them at the roadside, on the car, or at the mill. In this way it is also possible to take full advantage of the prices paid roadside or delivered at the mill.

Leading economists believe that over the long period (approximately 60 years) the value of stumpage will move gradually upward. They recognize, of course, the minor fluctuations in prices that are affected by business conditions. Every woodland owner should understand this trend in prices and should hold onto immature stumpage. Good trees should be kept growing when they are laying on the maximum amount of wood each year and thereby are earning the owner the most money.

Recommendations For Selling

EVERY NEW Hampshire woodland owner who plans to sell stumpage is urged to consider the following recommendations before selling:

1. Find out from sawmills and wood-using industries what prices they offer for various wood products in order that you may take advantage of

the best market. Compare the local prices with those quoted from other sections of the State.

2. Before selling, consult your neighbors who have recently disposed of their timber and use their experience as a guide. Ask your county forester. In many instances, failure to do this has resulted in the woodland owner not getting full value of the product.

3. Thoroughly investigate all local timber requirements and prices, since, in many cases, local markets pay better prices than outside markets because of the saving of transportation charges.

4. Advertise and secure competition among outside purchasers. The expense will be small and outside buyers will thus learn of chances to bid on timber in competition with local buyers.

5. Secure bids whenever practical, both by the lump and by log scale measure. A choice is thus offered, and a more profitable form of bid can be accepted.

6. Consider the responsibility of the prospective purchaser before making the sale in order to avoid slow payment, costly collections, and losses.

7. When there is quality timber to market, these trees are worth more than the average or poor quality tree. Be sure the buyer takes the factor of tree quality into consideration when offering you a price for stumpage.

8. Remember that standing timber usually increases in value. The owner, therefore, is not obliged to place his product on the market, if the price offered is not satisfactory. Use a written timber sale agreement, particularly where the cutting is done by the purchaser. Sell only trees that should be cut. These trees should be marked by the owner or his agent with the help and advice of a qualified forester. Reliable operators will make partial cutting by taking only the marked trees, if the owner insists.

9. In order to insure a market for forest products, a written contract is desirable before cutting starts on a lot.

Assistance Rendered By The County Forester

DEFORE MAKING a timber sale get in touch with your county forester. He can supply you with a sample contract form. Your county forester will assist you in the examination of your woodlands and make recommendations for managing them. He will help you or your agent in marking trees for cutting. He will explain the new 10 per cent yield tax on wood and timber when it is cut, and how to earn the 30 per cent tax abatement for practicing good forestry. The tax abatement is a reward to the owner (the person who has the responsibility of cutting the trees) for meeting the two major objectives of partial cutting: (1) Preserving rapidly-growing immature trees which will be more profitable to cut after a future growing period; and (2) providing for the reseeding of desirable species.

Owner Operation of Woodlands

WOODLAND OWNERS, especially farmers who have salable timber ready for market, should consider harvesting it themselves, especially when they have the labor and the team or tractor with which to do the job. The woodland owner who can get out his own logs or pulpwood can realize both the stumpage value and the price that would be paid for the labor involved.

Range of Prices Paid for Forest Products, November 1951

IT IS VERY difficult to list a range of prices paid for forest products. Quality, quantity, location, logging chance, demand, and other factors affect the price paid. The range in prices paid for hardwood stumpage and for roadside and mill deliveries is so varied that the prices quoted show an extremely wide range. The quality of hardwood varies greatly from generally poor quality in southern New Hampshire to a variation of poor and good quality in northern New Hampshire. Veneer grade logs bring an excellent price delivered at veneer mills.

 $\uparrow A$ fair method of determining stumpage values for a tract of timber is to compute the total cost of the operation (cutting-yarding), add about 20 percent for profit and risk, including cost of making roads, bridges, etc., and deduct the whole from the going roadside prices.

""Roadside" shall mean points where pulpwood is piled as close to a maintained public highway as state law or county or other local ordinances permit. Highways which are maintained at town, county or state expense and suitable for movement for fully loaded vehicles during at least 6 months of the year, are considered public highways. In all instances where pulpwood is sold at roadside, it must be possible for trucks to load and carry away the normal truck load of wood from the loading point without assistance.

$$\frac{1}{384} = \text{Number Cords}$$

$$\frac{48'' \times 8'}{384} = 1 \text{ cord}$$

If wood is longer or shorter than standard length (48"), divide standard length bolt length to get correct percentage.

Example: 39" divided by 48" equals 81%.

The wholesaler to whom he sells at \$100 MBF adds 10% commission plus freight and sells the item for \$121. The retailer sells it for 30.40% more than this price.

Lists of Forest Products Buyers*

NAMES OF BUYERS listed in this bulletin are those who have indicated to the county foresters that they are in the market now or at a later date to purchase one or more of the following: stumpage, logs, pulpwood, bolts, excelsior wood, and other forest products. In contacting forest products buyers and operators, it was found that a majority would consider cutting marked lots provided there was sufficient volume of timber on the lot to make it worthwhile to set a mill or carry on a logging operation. Owners can well consider giving options for further cuts to operators who will make partial cuttings in stands operated according to good forest management.
