

FOREST MARKET REPORT

1957

The Forest Market Situation *

Lumber

In response to continued record level of construction and industrial activity in 1956, with some leveling off, lumber production in New Hampshire continued at a high level during 1956. This situation reflected an active demand for stumpage during 1956 and the early months of 1957. The total 1956 lumber consumption in the United States was estimated at about 3 percent less than the consumption in 1955.

Housing is the most important single use of lumber. In 1952 an estimated 16.6 billion board feet, or 40 percent of all the lumber consumed in the United States, was used in the construction and maintenance of residential buildings. In 1956 housing starts were placed at about 1.1 million units, compared with 1.3 million units in 1955 and an average of 1.2 million units for the period 1950 to 1955.

During the next few years residential construction may continue to be lower than the average for the period 1950-1955 as the result of reduced family formation, reflecting the low birth rates that prevailed in the depressed 1930's. Residential construction tends to be maintained, however, by the continuous movement of city population to suburbs, by high birth rates which require larger houses, and increases in disposable income which permits improvement in the general level of housing. Government policy to provide liberal credit and otherwise encourage housing construction is also likely to continue to be an important factor.

During 1952 lumber consumption on farms, in railroad construction, and in mines amounted to 5.8 billion board feet, or 14 percent of all lumber consumed. Since then it is estimated that lumber consumption for these uses has not changed significantly. Lumber consumption in other types of construction, such as industrial, commercial, institutional, recreational, military and public utilities, amounted to an estimated 7.9 billion feet in 1952. Since 1952 lumber consumption for such construction has increased in response to sharply increased construction activity.

Shipment of agricultural and industrial commodities in 1952 required about 17 percent of all the lumber consumed or 6.9 billion board feet. Since 1952 demands for shipping materials have increased significantly in response to higher levels of economic activity, but lumber has had fairly strong competition from container board and other shipping materials.

The third major end use for lumber is in fabricated products, such as furniture, mill work, and a wide variety of other manufactured items. About 4.2 billion board feet, or 10 percent of all the lumber used in 1952, was consumed in the manufacture of these products. Since 1952 it is estimated that some increase has occurred in the use of lumber for manufactured products.

Lumber production in the West has increased from 3.5 billion feet in 1900 to an estimated 20.6 billion feet in 1956. The present western cut amounts to more than half of all the lumber produced in the United States. It includes about two-thirds of the softwood lumber.

The West is expected to continue to be the most important region of lumber production for a number of years because of its relatively great wealth of timber, especially old growth softwood timber.

The New Hampshire lumber market is greatly influenced by the lumber imported into the State. The bulk of this lumber comes from western United States.

Programs such as the Newington Air Base, federal aid for schools, federal road building, and industrial development help to stimulate residential development this increasing the local demand for lumber both for industrial and residential uses.

Between January and April, 1956, the wholesale price index of lumber increased from 127.6 to 130.6. This was slightly above the previous all time peak of 126.7 reached in March 1951. Between April and September, 1956, lumber prices dropped to 125.8.

From 1926 to September, 1956, wholesale lumber prices increased 279 percent, climbing from an index of 33.2 in 1926 to 125.8. Prices of all commodities, on the other hand, increased only 77 percent during this period. In the past 6 years, however, the wholesale price index for both lumber and all commodities has been relatively stable. As a result of this price situation the price received for standing timber is at or near an all time high throughout the country. Stumpage prices vary widely for given tracts of timber, however, depending upon tree species, timber quality, volume per acre, accessibility and logging conditions, and various other factors.

Pulpwood

Total pulpwood consumption, including the equivalent pulpwood content of pulp and paper imports, is estimated in 1956 at 43.3 million cords, which is an all time high.

Domestic forests are being called upon to supply the pulpwood for the rapid expansion in United States pulp and paper markets. This expansion during the latter part of 1956 started to level off.

Southern pine, western hemlock, Douglas-fir, spruce, and fir are most in demand for pulpwood. However, the consumption of hardwood pulpwood has been expanding. Pulpwood production in the South has increased rapidly from 1 million cords in 1930 to an estimated 29.9 million cords in 1956. Pulpwood production in the West increased from about 1.2 million cords in 1930 to an estimated 6.4 million cords in 1956.

Fifty years ago the North supplied nearly all the pulpwood produced in the United States, and as late as the early 1930's the northeast and the lake states still supplied more than half of the nation's cut. In contrast to the South and West, production has been increasing relatively slower due in part to increasing

shortages of the preferred softwoods. In recent years, production of semi-chemical and other hardwood pulps has increased rapidly and further expansion based on large hardwood resources of this section can be expected.

Pulpwood prices in 1956 and early 1957 were moderately higher than in 1955.

Veneer logs

Consumption of veneer logs and bolts in the United States has risen from 1.5 billion board feet in 1946 to 3.6 billion board feet in 1956 - an increase of 140 percent. Almost all the softwood veneer logs are produced in the West. Hardwood veneer logs are produced in the South and the North. The bulk of the veneer logs cut in New Hampshire comes from the northern part of the State.

Industrial Timber Products

Consumption of timber products, such as poles, posts, mine timbers, and a variety of other minor products in 1952, amounted to about 700 million cub. feet or about 8 percent of the industrial wood (all products except fuelwood) consumed in the United States. Consumption of individual products has shown variable trends in recent years but it is estimated that there has been little change in total wood consumption for such products. The demand for piling in New Hampshire depends upon local construction demands for such material. During early 1957 there was an active demand for piling.

Christmas Trees


Consumption of Christmas trees during 1956 is estimated at about 39 million trees, including about 27 million trees produced from domestic forests and 12 million trees imported from Canada.

The Long-term Outlook for Timber Products

It is estimated that the nation's population will increase from about 157 million people in 1952 to 210 million in 1975 and to 275 million in the year 2000. Gross national products, a more significant market indication for industrial raw materials, is expected to rise from a 1952 level of about \$365 billion to \$630 billion in 1975 and \$1,200 billion in the year 2000. These figures are average estimates.

On the basis of the above estimates of population and gross national products and with consideration of other factors affecting the consumption of timber products and competing materials, the United States Forest Service has made two projections of potential demands for timber products as shown in the following chart:

Recommendations for Selling

The New Hampshire woodland owners who plan to sell stumpage, logs, pulpwood, and other forest products are urged to consider the following recommendations before selling:

1. Find out from buyers of stumpage, logs, pulpwood, and other forest products the prices they offer in order that you may take advantage of the best market. Compare the local prices with those quoted from other sections of the State.

2. Before selling, consult your neighbors who have recently sold timber and use their experience as a guide. Ask your County Forester. In many instances, failure to do this has resulted in the woodland owner not getting full value of the product.

3. Thoroughly investigate all local timber requirements and prices since in many cases local markets pay better prices than outside markets because of the saving of transportation charges.

4. Advertise and secure competition among outside purchasers. The expense will be small and outside buyers will thus learn of chances to bid on timber in competition with local buyers.

5. Secure bids whenever possible, both by the lump sum sale based on closely estimated volume and by log scale measure. A choice is thus offered, and a more profitable form of bid can be accepted.

6. Consider the responsibility of the prospective purchaser before making the sale in order to avoid slow payment, costly collections, and losses.

7. When there is quality timber to market, these trees are worth more than the average or poor-quality tree. Be sure the buyer takes the factor of tree quality into consideration when offering you a price for stumpage.

8. Remember that standing timber usually increases in value and generally can be sold at any time. The owner, therefore, is not obliged to place his product on the market, if the price offered is not satisfactory. Sell only trees that should be cut. These trees should be marked by the owner or his agent with the help and advice of a qualified forester. Reliable operators will make partial cuttings by taking only the marked trees, if the owner insists.

9. A written timber sale agreement between buyer and seller is important before cutting starts on a lot. Sample sale agreement forms to fit different kinds of operations can be obtained from your County Forester.

Assistance Rendered by the County Forester

The County Forester helps woodland owners to help themselves. Your County Forester will assist you in the examination of your woodlands and make recommendations for managing them. He will help you or your agent in marking trees for cutting in limited amounts, and advise you in the marketing of forest products.

There are thousands of acres of young growing trees, such as pine, spruce, fir, and desirable hardwood, that can be converted into desirable stands of trees, if the overtopping weed trees are cut or killed. It is profitable to prune young, fast-growing, well-formed white pine with the purpose of growing quality logs that will yield clear lumber. Your County Forester can assist you in getting a forest improvement program started in the young stands on your woodlands.

Under the provisions of the Agricultural Conservation program and the Soil Bank program the Federal government shares the cost of woodland improvements and tree planting with woodland owners. Your County Forester can provide you with the information about these cost-sharing programs.

Range of Prices Paid for Forest Products, January 1957

Quality, quantity, location, logging chance, demand, and other factors affect the prices paid for stumpage, logs, pulpwood, piling, poles, fuelwood, and other forest products. The range in prices paid for hardwood stumpage and for roadside and mill deliveries is so varied that the prices quoted show an extremely wide range. The quality of hardwood varies greatly from generally poor quality in southern New Hampshire to a variation of poor and good quality in northern New Hampshire.

- Lengths: 25' 30' 35' 40' 45' 50' 55' 60' 65' 70' & 75' long
- Tops: Not less than 6" diameter and not more than 10" diameter under bark.
- Butts: Not less than 8" diameter and not more than 20" diameter under bark.
Material must be free from short crooks, excessive sweeps and rot.
No light between string line laid from center of top to center of butt.
Knots to be trimmed close to the body of the stick. Material need not be put on skids or brow in some cases.

Currently there is an increased demand for hardwood for piling with a few exceptions such as Birch and Poplar.
